History - Samuel Lincoln (c 1619-1690) son of Edward Lincoln of Hingham, Norfolk County, England, emigrated to America in 1637 with 2 elder brothers and settled at Hingham, Massachusetts. His son and grandson, Mordecai were iron founders. Mordecai

(1686-1736) moved to Chester County, Pa. His son John (1711-1773), a weaver settled in Rockingham County Virginia. His son Abraham settled in Kentucky, in 1780, and was killed by Indians in 1784. His son Thomas (1778-1851), born in Augusta County, Va. (now Rockingham) married Nancy Hanks (1783-1818) of Virginia, June 12, 1806 in Washington County, Kentucky. Their son Abraham 16th President of the United States was born on Rock Spring Farm, 3 miles from Hodgenville in Hardin (now Larue) County, Kentucky, February 12, 1809.
