SPECIFICATIONS: approximately 3 miles long, with 2 cantilever through truss spans 750 feet long and 57 feet wide.

SIGNIFICANCE: The "skyway" was built as part of the transcontinental Lincoln Highway and was among the first limited access "super highways" in the United States.
