f. Interview data: Source was interviewed at the Grace Hotel on 10 Oct 1991 by James L. Ross, SFC, USA.

2. Summary: Source provided handwritten military identification tag data and limited hearsay concerning several alleged U.S. remains currently maintained by a relative at an unknown location in Vietnam.

3. Information: On 9 Oct 91, Source telephoned the JTF-FA Detachment One office in Bangkok, Thailand, and requested a meeting with a JTF interviewer in order to provide information related to unaccounted-for Americans from the Vietnam War. On 10 Oct 91, RO met with Source at his hotel in Bangkok, Thailand. Source, a thirteen year resident of Canada, stated he had recently returned from a business trip to Ho Chi Minh City where he also visited several relatives. During his trip Source's brother-in-law alleged to possess four or five American remains which he wished to relinquish to the U.S. government in exchange for a monetary reward.

4. Source stated his brother-in-law discovered the remains at a helicopter crash site located near a former U.S. military base in South Vietnam. He was unable to provide additional details concerning his brother-in-law's acquisition of the remains or the current disposition of said remains. Source provided RO with one tooth and a handwritten copy of a military identification tag
