SC the same man who provided information for Report I81-022, also provided a second report when interviewed at SD on 15 October 81. He reported seeing two caucasians in captivity in mid-August 1975 in the vicinity of the Bau Lam re-education camp in Xuyen Moc District of Phuoc Tuy at YS 7570. SC said he was gathering wood outside the camp one evening at 8 PM when he saw 3 NVA soldiers escorting the two caucasians, both wearing black pajamas, from a distance of about 15 meters. He only saw them briefly as they passed but said he heard one of them talk in English to the other saying he was "thirsty". For this reason SC said he thought they were Americans. SC described them as both about 1.8 meters tall, medium build. He could not recall hair color or footwear. SC said it was still bright enough to see them clearly at 8 PM that night. He had no reason, other than hearing them speak English, to cause him to think that the two caucasians were Americans. SC could add nothing further to this report as he neither saw or heard of the two men after that.

SC was interviewed at SD I, Indonesia, on 15 October 81. He stated that as a former ARVN soldier he was sent to a re-education camp from June 1975 to June 1978 at Bau Lam Village (YS 7570), Xuyen Moc District, Phuoc Tuy Province. In May 1978 SC said he was assigned to a 200 man labor group to transport paddy rice from Bao Lam Camp to a camp 25 kilometers northwest into the jungle. They walked 5 or 6 hours before reaching their destination, each man carrying about 18 kilograms of rice. The camp they arrived at was set in the jungle under high trees that made it invisible from the air. It had a fence of pickets and barbed wire 3 meters or more high. Inside this fence, a distance of 20 to 25 meters from where SC was standing, he said he saw a caucasian man wearing black pajamas and no footwear. The man was seated and bound by the wrists and ankles with a shackle-like device that SC diagrammed as follows: SC said he observed the caucasian for about 30 minutes and he described him as slim, brownish hair with a high forehead (perhaps balding) and appeared emaciated from lack of food. SC could not estimate his age, nor could he tell how tall he was because of his seated position. Other than that one prisoner, no one else seemed to be in confinement there. SC did not see the whole camp and does not know who else might have been in there, nor did he have any idea what was going to happen to the 3 1/2 tons or so of unhusked rice they carried to the camp. All 200 porters should have had a good look at the caucasian prisoner according to SC. None of the cadre who came with them mentioned the caucasian or the name of the camp. SC said he thought the area was formerly the VC May Tau secret zone. After the 30 minute rest the 200 laborers went back to the Bau Lam camp. SC said he never heard anything about the caucasian prisoner again. SC was asked to draw a sketch map of the area showing relative locations of the two camps and other landmarks and commo routes. His sketch is attached.



REF: JCRC-LNB REPORT T81-022 AND 181-023, 3 NOV 81.

1. REFERENCED REPORTS PROVIDE TESTIMONIES OF WITH REGARD TO HIS LIVE SIGHTINGS OF AMERICANS IN PHUOC TUY PROVINCE. REQUEST YOU ATTEMPT TO REINTERVIEW *Sc* TO OBTAIN ADDITIONAL DETAILS OF HIS SIGHTINGS. REF REPORT 181-022: HAVE *Sc* DESCRIBE IN AS MUCH DETAIL AS POSSIBLE THE LAYOUT OF THE CAMP (SIZE, GUARD TOWERS, BUILDINGS, ETC.) WHERE THE CAUCASIAN WAS HELD. APPROXIMATELY HOW LONG DID HE REMAIN AT THE CAMP TO WHICH HE AND 200 OTHER MEN DELIVERED RICE? *Sc* STATED THAT HE DID NOT SEE ANYONE ELSE, OTHER THAN THE CAUCASIAN, IN CONFINEMENT AT THE CAMP. APPROXIMATELY HOW MANY GUARDS DID *Sc* SEE AT THE CAMP? IN HIS TESTIMONY, *Sc* STATED THAT HE HAD TRAVELED APPROXIMATELY 25 KILOMETERS NORTHWEST INTO THE JUNGLE TO THE CAMP WHERE THE CAUCASIAN WAS HELD. HIS SKETCH, HOWEVER, INDICATES A NORTHEASTERLY ROUTE. WE MUST HAVE AS ACCURATE A LOCATION AS POSSIBLE IN ORDER TO CONFIRM THROUGH AERIAL IMAGERY THE EXISTENCE OF THE CAMP. REQUEST YOU AGAIN HAVE *Sc* PINPOINT THE EXACT LOCATION OF THIS CAMP AND PROVIDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE SURROUNDING TERRAIN (HILLS, RIVERS, LAKES, ROADS, ETC.). HAVE *Sc* ALSO PROVIDE THE NAMES OF ANY VF THE 200 PERSONS WHO ACCOMPANIED HIM TO THIS CAMP AND REQUEST A CHECK OF REFUGEE RECORDS TO SEE IF ANY OF THESE PERSONS MAY HAVE ENTERED THE REFUGEE STREAM. REF REPORT 181-023: *Sc* STATED THAT HE CLEARLY SAW TWO CAUCASIANS IN THE VICINITY OF THE BAU LAM REEDUCATION CAMP IN MID-AUGUST 1975. WHAT GAVE TIEN THE IMPRESSION THAT THESE TWO CAUCASIANS WERE PRISONERS AND NOT MERELY WALKING ALONG WITH THE THREE GUARDS? HAVE HIM PROVIDE A MORE ACCURATE DESCRIPTION OF THE CAUCASIANS. *Sc* SAID HE HEARD ONE CAUCASIAN SAY TO THE OTHER THAT HE WAS "THIRSTY" AND WAS THUS ABLE TO CONCLUDE THAT THEY WERE BOTH AMERICANS. REQUEST YOU ASSESS *Sc* ENGLISH LANGUAGE CAPABILITY. IN ORDER TO ADEQUATELY EVALUATE *Sc* CAPABILITY AS AN OBJECTIVE OBSERVER AND REPORTER, REQUEST YOU OBTAIN BIOGRAPHIC DATA, TO INCLUDE: FAMILY, EDUCATION, MILITARY SERVICE AND WORK EXPERIENCE. OBTAIN DETAILS OF HIS ESCAPE FROM VIETNAM. WHEN DID HE ARRIVE AT PULAU GALANG? DID HE BRING HIS FAMILY OUT OF VIETNAM WITH HIM? IF NOT, WHY DID HE LEAVE VIETNAM AND LEAVE THEM BEHIND? *Sc* STATED THAT HE SPENT APPROXIMATELY THREE YEARS AT THE BAU LAM REEDUCATION CAMP. HAVE HIM DRAW A DIAGRAM OF THE CAMP AND INCLUDE BUILDINGS, GUARD TOWERS, FENCES AND FEATURES OF THE SURROUNDING TERRAIN. HAVE HIM STATE THE DISTANCE OF THIS CAMP FROM TOWN OF XUYEN MVC.
3. PROVIDE RESULTS OF REINTERVIEW DIRECTLY TO DI-7C.

1. FOLLOWING RESPONSES TO THE QUESTIONS POSED IN REF B:
 A. REPORT 181-022: THE CAMP WHICH CONTAINED THE AMERICAN
 WAS SURROUNDED BY THREE SEPARATE BARBED WIRE FENCES USING
 IRON POSTS MADE FROM U.S. TYPE ANGLE IRON. TWO SECTIONS
 OF ANGLE IRON WERE WELDED TOGETHER AT THE CENTER AND A HOLE
 DRILLED TO ALLOW A BOLT TO GO THROUGH. THE POSTS WERE
 APPROXIMATELY THREE METERS HIGH AND SPACED AT THREE METER
 INTERVALS. THE THREE BARBED WIRE FENCES HAD STRIPS OF WIRE
 TIED VERTICALLY AT APPROX FOUR INCH INTERVALS CREATING A
 BOX PATTERN ON EACH FENCE. SMALL THATCHED HUTS WERE
 LOCATED INSIDE AT EACH CORNER OF THE RECTANGULAR SHAPED
 COMPOUND. THE AMERICAN PRISONER WAS HELD IN A 20 BY 10
 METER THATCHED HUT IN THE CENTER OF THE COMPOUND. SOURCE
 DID NOT OBSERVE ANY OTHER BUILDINGS (SOURCE WAS QUESTIONED
 ABOUT LATHINES, KITCHEN, DISPENSARY, ETC., BUT STATED THAT
 HE DID NOT TRAVEL ALL AROUND THE COMPOUND AND DIDN'T NOTICE
 ANY OTHER BUILDINGS.) SOURCE ARRIVED AT THE COMPOUND
 FROM THE BAU LAM REEDUCATION CAMP TO PICK UP RICE. AT THE
 ARRIVAL, SOURCE WAS ALLOWED TO REST FOR ONE HOUR AND THEN
 EAT. AFTER EATING, SOURCE LOADED UNHUSKED RICE (THOC)
 WHICH HE CARRIED BACK TO BAU LAM CAMP. SOURCE
 OBSERVED APPROXIMATELY 15 MALE AND THREE OR FOUR FEMALE
 PERSONNEL WHO HE BELIEVED WERE ASSIGNED TO THE CAMP WHERE
 THE AMERICAN WAS HELD. (SOURCE SPECULATED THAT THE FEMALES
 WERE MEDICS OR COOKS.) SOURCE DID NOT OBSERVE ANYONE STAND-
 ING GUARD BUT STATED THAT SOME OF THE MEN WERE ARMED WITH
 AK47, D40, AND K54 TYPE WEAPONS (DIDN'T REMEMBER HOW
 MANY). SOURCE STATED HE WALKED IN A NORTH/NORTHEASTERLY
 DIRECTION TO THE CAMP (VIC COORD YS 5866, MAP HC48-8).
 SOURCE STATED THAT SEVERAL OTHER MEN OBSERVED THE

AMERICAN INCLUDING NAME APPROX 30 YEARS OLD, POR
 SAIGON, SGT IN ARVN-111 AND NAME (43-45 YEAR OLD
 ETHNIC CAMBODIAN). BOTH MEN WERE STILL UNDERGOING RE-
 EDUCATION AND HAD NOT ENTERED REFUGEE CHANNELS ACCORDING TO
 SOURCE. ANOTHER INMATE, NAME APPROX 43 YEARS
 OLD AND FORMER MEMBER OF NATIONAL POLICE SPECIAL BRANCH
 IN PHUOC TUY PROVINCE, HAD ALSO OBSERVED THE AMERICAN BUT
 HE HAD BEEN EXECUTED AFTER ATTEMPTING TO ESCAPE FROM BAU
 LAM REEDUCATION CAMP. THE COMMANDER OF THE CAMP WHERE THE
 AMERICAN WAS HELD WAS TAI CONG. NAME WAS CONCURRENTLY
 THE COMMANDER OF BAU LAM REEDUCATION CAMP.
 B. REPORT 181-022: WHEN SOURCE FIRST OBSERVED THE TWO
 CAUCASIANS HE THOUGHT THEY WERE SOVIETS. THEN HE HEARD ONE
 OF THE CAUCASIANS SAY "I AM THIRSTY" WHICH LED HIM TO
 BELIEVE THAT THE TWO WERE AMERICANS. SOURCE INDICATED
 DURING AN APPROX 5 MINUTE ENGLISH LANGUAGE DISCUSSION WITH
 INTERVIEWER THAT HE HAD A LIMITED SPEAKING AND
 COMPREHENDING ABILITY IN ENGLISH. SOURCE HAS HAD EXPOSURE
 TO ENGLISH LANGUAGE TRAINING AT GALANG RPC. SOURCE MAIN-
 TAINED THAT HE WAS ABLE TO UNDERSTAND THE AMERICAN SINCE HE
 HAD STUDIED ENGLISH AT THE VIETNAMESE-AMERICAN ASSOCIATION
 IN SAIGON FROM 1965 TO 1968. BIO DATA: FATHER-

NAME DATA MCHT ARVMT, MOTHER-
 NAME DATA HOUSEWIFE. SOURCE HAD
 12 YEARS OF FORMAL EDUCATION AND WAS A HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATE.
 SOURCE ENTERED MILITARY SERVICE IN 1970 AFTER SERVING AS
 COORD FOR REVOLUTIONARY TRAINING CENTER AT VUNG TAU FOR TWO
 YEARS. SOURCE SERVED AS ASSISTANT PLATOON LEADER IN
 POPULAR FORCES AT LONG DIEN DISTRICT, PHUOC TUY PROVINCE,
 FROM 1970 UNTIL 1974. IN 1974 SOURCE WAS ASSIGNED AS
 DEPUTY FOR HAMLET SECURITY IN LONG TAI HAMLET, LONG DIEN
 DISTRICT, PHUOC TUY PROVINCE WHERE HE WORKED UNTIL THE
 COMMUNIST TAKEOVER IN APRIL 75. SOURCE WAS IN REEDUCATION
 FROM 1975 UNTIL 1978. AFTER RELEASE SOURCE WORKED AS A
 MOTORCYCLE MECHANIC AND HELPED HIS FAMILY WITH RICE
 FARMING. PRIOR TO ESCAPE SOURCE'S RELATIVES COLLECTED 4000
 DONG WHICH HE PAID FOR PASSAGE ON A 9.5 METER BOAT ALONG
 WITH 27 OTHER PEOPLE. SOURCE'S GROUP BEGAN DEPARTING FROM
 LONG DIEN IN SMALL GROUPS OF ESCAPEES BEGINNING AT APPROX

SC has provided two firsthand sightings of Caucasians seen in the Kien Hoa area of South Vietnam. SC's first sighting occurred in May, 1978 when he was assigned to a 200-man labor group to transport paddy rice from Bao Lam Camp, where he had been in reeducation since June 1975, to a camp 25 kilometers northwest into the jungle. This camp was surrounded by three separate barbed wire fences ~~using iron post~~ made from ~~V.S. type angle iron~~ ^{approximately} three meters tall. Small thatched huts were located inside at each corner of the rectangular-shaped compound. Inside the compound, from a distance of 20 to 25

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meters from where SC was standing, he stated he saw a Caucasian man seated and bound by the wrists and ankles with a shackle-like device. The prisoner was held in a 20 by 10 meter thatched hut in the center of the compound. SC did not observe any other buildings as he did not have the opportunity to travel all around the compound. In addition, SC did not see anyone else in confinement there, but he did observe approximately 15 males ^(some of whom were armed) and three or four female personnel who he believed were assigned to the camp. SC described this camp as being located approximately 25 kilometers north/northeast of the Bao Lam camp.

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None of the cadre who accompanied the 200-man labor group mentioned the Caucasian or the name

of the camp. SC said he thought the area

was formerly the VC May Tau secret zone. SC

never ^{again} saw or heard anything about the Caucasian prisoners.





account of the sighting varied in his two accounts only five months apart. In the initial version he transported rice to the camp and in the second he went there to pick up rice. While maintaining he could not see the entire camp, he never-the-less provided a description of a single detention facility. If in fact had been to the area in question, there are numerous structures which are readily visible and at distances of no more than 25-50 meters at most. description of drawing of his own camp does not favorably correspond to the confirmed configuration of the Bau Lam Reeducation Camp.

DIA tentatively concludes that did not see the individual as claimed and under the circumstances he reported. While may have some knowledge of the existence of two camps in eastern Dong Nai Province, his account is sufficiently contradictory and totally inaccurate to substantiate his claim to have been there for the time stated. DIA views account as a deliberate fabrication.

DIA does confirm one French priest detained in eastern Dong Nai Province during for approximately 2 months in 1975. The priest was not detained, isolated although kept in a small camp with approximately 200 former military personnel, lower ranking local officials and religious leaders. His detention site is believed to have been in the May Tao mountain area.
