APPENDIX 9 TO ANNEX C TO JTF-FA OPLAN 1-01

SAFETY AND RISK ASSESSMENT REF (A) JTF-FA HANDBOOK

1. SAFETY

A. SAFETY IS THE NUMBER ONE PRIORITY FOR ALL JTF-FA ACTIVITIES. THERE IS ABSOLUTELY NOTHING IN THE MISSION OF THE JTF THAT REQUIRES THE RISKING OF LIFE OR LIMB TO ACCOMPLISH THE MISSION. THE JTF-FA STANDARDS OF CONDUCT DEFINE BEHAVIOR AND SPECIFIC ACTIONS WHICH REDUCE THE POTENTIAL THREAT OF SERIOUS INJURY TO JTF PERSONNEL.

B. JTF-FA STANDARDS OF CONDUCT (ISSUED SEPARATELY BEFORE DEPLOYMENTS BY THE JTF-FA J3) ARE REQUIRED OF ALL JTF-FA, CILHI PERSONNEL AND AUGMENTEES WHILE DEPLOYED IN SE ASIA.

C. IN ADDITION TO THOSE SAFETY ORIENTED MEASURES IDENTIFIED IN THE STANDARDS OF CONDUCT, THE FOLLOWING PRINCIPLES ALSO APPLY:

(1) EVERY ONE IS A SAFETY OFFICER/NCO. IT IS INCUMBENT UPON EVERYONE THAT WHEN AN UNSAFE CONDITION EXISTS OR IS OBSERVED THAT IT BE BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF THE SENIOR INDIVIDUAL IN CHARGE. THAT INDIVIDUAL WILL THEN CONDUCT A HASTY RISK ASSESSMENT TO DETERMINE IF

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CONTINUING THE ACTIVITY IS REQUIRED AND CAN IT BE ACCOMPLISHED IN A SAFER MANNER.

(2) PERSONNEL WILL NOT TOUCH, PICK UP, KICK, TOSS OR DISTURB ANY ORDNANCE DISCOVERED ANYWHERE THROUGHOUT SE ASIA. THIS IS NOT ONLY APPLICABLE TO CRASH SIGHTS BUT WHERE EVER SOMETHING IS DISCOVERED. SE ASIA HAS A SIGNIFICANT AMOUNT OF ORDNANCE AND MINES. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF ANY INDIVIDUAL TO NOTIFY THE TEAM LEADER AND EOD TECHNICIAN (IF AVAILABLE) UPON DISCOVERY OF ANY UNKNOWN ITEM.

(3) JTF-FA PERSONNEL ARE PROHIBITED FROM OPERATING MOTOR VEHICLES IN THAILAND, VIETNAM, LAOS, AND CAMBODIA, EXCEPT WHEN A WAIVER IS GRANTED BY CJTF-FA OR IN AN EMERGENCY WHERE IMMEDIATE TRANSPORTATION IS ESSENTIAL AND NO OTHER MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION IS AVAILABLE. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS PROHIBITION, MOTOR VEHICLES INCLUDE MOTORCYCLES, MOTOR SCOOTERS, AND MOTORIZED BICYCLES. JTF-FA PROVIDES VEHICLES AND LOCAL NATIONAL DRIVERS FOR THE OFFICIAL TRAVEL OF PERSONNEL OPERATING IN THAILAND, VIETNAM, LAOS, AND CAMBODIA.

(4) ANOTHER IMPORTANT AREA OF SAFETY CONCERNS SANITATION AND MEDICAL ISSUES. WHILE DEPLOYED TO AUSTERE ENVIRONMENTS, PERSONNEL MUST REMAIN EVER COGNIZANT OF INSECTS, WATER, FOOD AND MEDICAL HAZARDS. DAILY PREVENTIVE MEASURES AND COMMON SENSE WILL SERVE THE INDIVIDUAL WELL THROUGHOUT THE ENTIRE JFA. ANNEX Q DETAILS MEDICAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL SAFETY CONCERNS.

2. RISK MANAGEMENT

A. OPERATIONS IN SOUTHEAST ASIA ARE INHERENTLY DANGEROUS. EFFECTIVELY MANAGING THE RISKS ASSOCIATED WITH THE MISSION IS A CRITICAL ASPECT TO PRECLUDE PERSONAL INJURY AND ENSURE SAFE OPERATIONS AND MISSION ACCOMPLISHMENT AT ALL LEVELS. RISK MANAGEMENT IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS AND INVOLVES A FIVE STEP PROCESS:

- (1) IDENTIFY HAZARDS - IDENTIFY HAZARDS OR FACTORS THAT MAY ADVERSELY AFFECT FIELD OPERATIONS.
- (2) ASSESS HAZARDS - DETERMINE EXTENT OF HAZARDS DETRIMENTAL TO MISSION.
- (3) MAKE RISK DECISION - REDUCE RISK TO THAT WHICH IS MISSION ESSENTIAL.
- (4) IMPLEMENT CONTROLS - ESTABLISH MEASURES NECESSARY TO CONTROL RISKS.
- (5) SUPERVISE - ENSURE CONTROL MEASURES ARE FOLLOWED.

B. THE JTF-FA RISK MANAGEMENT PROCESS IS DETAILED IN THE JTF-FA RISK MANAGEMENT CARD. THIS CARD IS AVAILABLE FROM THE JTF-FA SAFETY OFFICER AND IS ALSO INCLUDED IN REF (A). EACH TEAM LEADER/ASSISTANT TEAM LEADER MUST:

- (1) PERFORM INITIAL RISK ASSESSMENT FOR OVERALL JFA AND ANNOTATE RESULTS IN THE RISK CARD MATRIX.
- (2) IDENTIFY MANEUVERS/TASK WHICH REQUIRE SPECIAL EQUIPMENT OR TRAINING, OR WHICH HAVE BEEN PREVIOUSLY

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IDENTIFIED AS HAVING SAFETY/HAZARD CONCERNS.

(3) MEDIATE RISKS, AS REQUIRED, USING CHART ON THE BACK PAGE OF THE RISK CARD.

(4) MEDIATE AND REASSESS RISKS IN THE HIGH/X-HIGH CATEGORY.

(5) BRIEF CJTF-FA/DCO ON ALL MANEUVERS/ACTIONS WHICH REMAIN IN THE HIGH/X-HIGH CATEGORY AND ANY OTHER SAFETY ISSUES IDENTIFIED IN STEP 2 ABOVE.

(6) REVALIDATE RISK ASSESSMENT IN-COUNTRY PRIOR TO MISSION EXECUTION.

1. SITUATION. SEE BASIC OPLAN.

2. MISSION. JTF-FA PLANS AND CONDUCTS PASSIVE OPERATIONAL SECURITY MEASURES IN ORDER TO ENHANCE FORCE PROTECTION AND INFORMS JTF-FA PERSONNEL AND AUGMENTEES OF POTENTIAL TERRORIST AND CRIMINAL THREATS THROUGHOUT SE ASIA.

/***** BEGINNING OF SECTION 002 *****/

3. EXECUTION

A. CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS. JTF-FA CONDUCTS OPERATIONAL SECURITY REQUIREMENTS THROUGH FORMAL TRAINING, AREA ORIENTED BRIEFINGS, ANALYSIS AND DISSEMINATION OF THREAT/CRIMINAL THREATS IN SE ASIA.

B. TASKS

(1) J1

(A) COORDINATE ALL TRAVEL FOR PERSONNEL TRAVELING TO HIGH OR MEDIUM THREAT COUNTRIES IN SUPPORT OF JTF-FA OPERATIONS IAW DOD TRAVEL SECURITY POLICY.

(B) NOTIFY SUPPORTING COMMANDS OF ALL ACTIVITIES INVOLVING AUGMENTED PERSONNEL.

(2) J2

(A) PROVIDE FORCE PROTECTION/ANTITERRORISM AND CRIMINAL THREAT PORTION FOR ALL PRE DEPLOYMENT BRIEFS.

(B) ENSURE TIMELY DISSEMINATION IN ANY CHANGE OF THREAT CONDITION IN SE ASIA.

(C) MAINTAIN AND COORDINATE WITH CJTF-FA AND DETS, CURRENT THREAT AND CRIMINAL ASSESSMENTS FOR COUNTRIES OF OPERATIONS.

(3) J3

(A) CONDUCT AT/FP TRAINING FOR ALL JTF-FA PERSONNEL AND AUGMENTEES IF REQUIRED.

(B) REVIEW MISSION ESSENTIAL VULNERABILITIES AND DETERMINE APPLICABILITY TO JFAS.

(C) BE PREPARED TO EXECUTE RAPID RE DEPLOYMENT OF PERSONNEL AND EQUIPMENT IN THE EVENT OF AN UNTENABLE FORCE PROTECTION ISSUE.

(D) DEVELOP IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE APPLICABLE DETACHMENT, DETAILED AT/FP CONTINGENCY PLANS FOR ALL

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OPERATIONS. COORDINATE AT/FP CONTINGENCY PLANS WITH USCINCPAC J33 FOR ALL OPERATIONS IN AREAS WHERE THREAT LEVELS ARE ASSESSED AS MEDIUM OR HIGHER.

(4) J4. PROVIDE FUNDING FOR PHYSICAL SECURITY ENHANCEMENTS AS REQUESTED.

(5) J5. DURING NEGOTIATIONS, ADDRESS THE COMMAND'S CONCERNS FOR HOST NATION SECURITY AT THE DETACHMENTS, BILLETING AND DURING FIELD OPERATIONS.

(6) DETACHMENT COMMANDERS

(A) COORDINATE WITH RESPECTIVE CHIEFS OF MISSION FOR COUNTRY THREAT LEVELS.

(B) PLAN FOR CONTINGENCY OPERATIONS AND PRIORITIZE THE EVACUATION OF JTF-FA PERSONNEL WHEN DIRECTED.

(C) CONSIDER PRIMARY AND ALTERNATE MEANS AND ROUTES FOR THE WITHDRAWAL OF PERSONNEL FROM REMOTE SITES.

(D) COORDINATE WITH HOST NATIONS AND EMBASSY PERSONNEL FOR INCREASED SECURITY POSTURE IN THE EVENT OF THREAT LEVEL INCREASE.

(E) COORDINATE WITH HOST NATIONS FOR ON SITE RESPONSIBILITY IN THE EVENT A SERIOUS INCIDENT.

D. COORDINATING INSTRUCTIONS

(1) RADICAL FORCE PROTECTION ACTIONS SHOULD NOT BE UNDERTAKEN WITHOUT CONCURRENCE OF THE HOST NATION, CJTF-FA, LOCAL EMBASSY AND USCINCPAC EXCEPT FOR THE PRESERVATION OF LIFE AND PREVENTION OF SERIOUS INJURY.

(2) DURING CRISIS SITUATIONS, JTF-FA WILL MAN THE EOC WITH PRIMARY STAFF MEMBERS AND INFORM USCINCPAC J3/J2 AND COMMAND CENTER OF ALL ON GOING ACTIVITY.

(3) SUBVERSION AND ESPIONAGE MEASURES. JTF-FA PERSONNEL AND AUGMENTEES HAVE BEEN CONTACTED BY FOREIGN NATIONALS SOLICITING INFORMATION OF A MILITARY NATURE EXTERNAL TO THE MISSION OF THE JOINT TASK FORCE. IN THESE SITUATIONS, ALL PERSONNEL WILL COMPLY WITH ALL STANDING OPERATIONAL SECURITY MEASURES. INCIDENTS SHOULD BE REPORTED TO JTF-FA/SSO AND LOCAL US EMBASSY PERSONNEL. IF WARRANTED, INTERVIEWS BY COGNIZANT SERVICE COUNTER-INTELLIGENCE COMPONENTS MAY BE SCHEDULED.
