THE NVA GO TO KHLEK KHLAK (1246N/10620E, NIS) EVERY DAY TO BUY FOOD FOR "THE FOREIGNERS" (ED1UNFI). THIS CAMP REPORTEDLY HOLDS THE EIGHT US AND 23 ARVN PWS PREVIOUSLY DETAINED AT A PW CAMP AT PHUMI LA (1241N/1061E, NIS) (ED1NFI).

B. CIRCUMSTANCES OF ACQUISITION OTC 6011372 OBTAINED THE INFORMATION IN THIS REPORT FROM AN UNIDENTIFIED CHAM BUSINESSMAN AND UNIDENTIFIED LOCAL VILLAGERS IN KHLEK KHLAK.

C. COMMENTS OF THE COLLECTOR: THE UNIDENTIFIED CHAM BUSINESSMAN PREVIOUSLY SUPPLIED FOOD TO THE PW CAMP AT PHUMI LA HE WAS TOLD BY AN UNIDENTIFIED NVA SOLDIER THAT THE PHUMI LA CAMP WOULD NO LONGER NEED FOOD, BUT THAT HE, THE CHAM BUSINESSMAN, SHOULD SELL HIS FOODSTUFF AT KHLEK KHLAK (ED1NFI).

On 10 June 1966,		
received information, the truth of which cannot be judged (6), from Detachment A-414, SFG, same location. The information was from a Confidential Source, whose reliability is unknown (F) and concerned American personnel allegedly held captive by hostile foreign elements. The information is substantially as follows:		
On 9 June 1966, at 1700 hours, a Cambodian school teacher, not further identified (NFI), reported six Americans, NFI, held captive in Cambodia, vicinity XT 0008. Source further reported two of the prisoners were wearing fatigue trousers and no shirts, and allegedly received preferential treatment. The remaining four wore black pajamas.		
AGENT'S NOTES: The undersigned has contacted the Commanding Officer and the Intelligence Sergeant, Detachment A-414, 5th SFG, in an attempt to arrange a meeting between Source and undersigned, to further identify alleged captive personnel.

Identification could not be made based on the information contained in the cited Agent Report.

4. Report of Findings On 18 July 1966, furnished information, the truth of which cannot be judged (6), obtained from a Confidential Source, whose reliability is unknown (F). The information concerns American Prisoners of War (POWs) in Binh Ducur Province, RVN, and is summarized as follows: On 10 July 1966, a company of the 76th Regiment, consisting of hardcore Communists, escorted an unknown number of Vietnamese Communists (Viet Cong) (VC), transporting weapons, seven Caoangians, and two Negro POWs, plus an unknown number of Republic of Vietnam (RVN) POWs of the 1st Division, from An Ling (XT 075 524), Binh Ducur Province, RVN, to the dense jungle at Ba Hao Stream, in the vicinity of (XT 175 405), Long Khanh Province, RVN. The POWs would then be taken to a VC prison camp located in the vicinity of (YT 155 404), Long Khanh Province, RVN. The prison camp is guarded by one VC company, destination unknown, located in the vicinity of (YT 155 396), Long Khanh Province, RVN. The VC company is believed to be part of the Son Be (sic) District Forces, and is armed with one 30 caliber machine gun, eight grenade launchers, three automatic weapons, and an unknown number of sub-machine guns and Russian rifles. Most of the company is composed of hostiles. The company from the 76th Regiment will return to Tan Khai Village (XH 770 771), An Son District, Binh Lang Province, RVN. Source received the information from [redacted] in Chanh Long Village, located at approximately (XT 660 230), Phu Cuong District, Binh Ducur Province, RVN. [redacted] allegedly has a nephew named [redacted] who was working as a liaison man for the company from the 76th Regiment, and disclosed the information when he visited [redacted]. AGENT'S NOTES: Detachment C-1 evaluated the above information as F-6. On 17 August 1966, the files of Company B, 519th MI Bn (Fld A), APC US Forces 36243, were examined concerning the above named individuals and met with negative results.
