Summary: Naval officer. Official and general correspondence, orders to duty, speech, article, and book file, memoranda, notes, printed material, photographs, and other papers relating primarily to King's activities as commander in chief of the United States Fleet and chief of naval operations during World War II.

Scope and Content Note

The papers of Ernest Joseph King (1878-1956) extend chiefly from 1908 to his death in 1956, with the bulk of the material concentrated in the period 1936-1952. The collection consists of correspondence, subject files, memoranda, reports, orders, notes, and associated material organized in six series: [Orders to Duty](#); [General Correspondence](#); [Subject File](#); [Speech, Article, and Book File](#); [Miscellany](#); and [2023 Addition](#).

In the early years of his career, King was a submarine officer and from 1923 to 1926 he was commander of the Submarine Base in New London, Connecticut. There are several folders of material for this tour of duty, the most important of which

documents the salvaging of the *S-51* sunk off Block Island in September 1925. King was in charge of the successful raising of the *S-51*, considered an outstanding accomplishment as it was generally thought that a submarine could not be raised from a depth of 125-130 feet of water. For this he was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal.

From submarines, King moved into aviation, qualifying as a naval pilot in 1927. In 1933 he was appointed chief of the Bureau of Aeronautics, serving in that post until 1936, when he assumed command of the Aircraft Base and Aircraft Scouting Force in San Diego. King was promoted to vice admiral in 1938 and given command of all the aircraft carriers of the fleet. Files for this period of his life are a valuable source for studying the growth and development of military aviation.

King's papers for the World War II period and beyond are particularly significant. As commander in chief of the United States Fleet and chief of Naval Operations, Admiral King attended the Atlantic Charter Meeting (1941), the Quebec Conference (1943), the Cairo and Teheran Conferences (1943), and the Yalta Conference (1945). After the war, various individuals frequently sought information from him concerning these conferences and also about particular aspects of United States military and naval operations. Wherever possible, King was ready to cooperate and supply essential information. For example, he explained to Quentin James Reynolds and Robert E. Sherwood the origins of General James Harold Doolittle's 1942 air raid on Tokyo. Marine Corps General Merritt Austin Edson was interested in learning the story behind the Guadalcanal campaign. King responded with a letter of four pages that detailed his determined efforts, over strong opposition, to strike the Japanese in the Solomon Islands immediately after the Battle of Midway (June 1942). The letter also reveals the evolution of King's philosophy of Pacific strategy, beginning with his personal experiences at the Asiatic station during the early years of the century. Other correspondence in this vein is that of Walter Muir Whitehill, coauthor of *Fleet Admiral King: A Naval Record* (1952); Merritt Austin Edson for Pacific Island strategy; Bernard M. Baruch, on international control of atomic weapons; Ferdinand Eberstadt, on national security organization; and Richard S. Edwards, on matters relating to the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Material in the [Subject File](#) supplements much of this correspondence.

The [Speech, Article, and Book File](#) contain manuscript drafts of *Fleet Admiral King* and the rough notes for the book. Also in the file drafts and final copies of King's speeches and lectures. Material from his teaching days at Annapolis and items such as his thesis written at the Naval War College (1932) on "The Influence of the National Policy on the Strategy of a War" show the development of his thought in the field of world politics.

Nimitz, Charles Frederick Algernon Portal, Viscount Portal of Hungerford, Franklin D. Roosevelt, Dorothy Thompson, Harry S. Truman, and Orville Wright.

The [2023 Addition](#) includes a 1991 issue of *Pull Together*, a newsletter of the Naval Historical Foundation and the Naval History Center, with the article "Admiral King talks about Allied Strategy, July 1943," and a declassified copy of King's 1947 speech "Some Aspects of the High Command in World War II."
