Summary: Activist, educator, and journalist. Writings, correspondence, newspapers, research files, legal documents, photographs, memoranda, interview transcripts, news clippings, audio recordings, video recordings, and printed matter in both physical and digital formats primarily relating to Ruiz's involvement in the Chicano Movement.

Acquisition Information

The papers of Raul Ruiz were given to the Library of Congress Prints and Photographs Division by Marcela A. Ponce and Marta Sanchez in 2024. Manuscript material was transferred to the Manuscript Division in 2024.

Processing History

The papers of Raul Ruiz were arranged and described by Nate Scheible with the assistance of Maria Farmer and Kathleen O'Neill in 2024.

Digital files were received as part of the papers on a variety of storage media, each of which was assigned a unique digital ID number. Use the digital ID number to request access copies of the files associated with each media. A description of the standard processes taken on all born digital records can be found in the Processing History Note: Born Digital Collection Material at <https://hdl.loc.gov/loc.mss/eadmss.digital>.

Some text files were normalized to .pdf to facilitate access. Some media were damaged or corrupt. Staff disk imaged these media and extracted the files from the disk images. During processing and for administrative purposes, some files were removed from their original locations and combined with other digital IDs to colocate similar materials and improve access.

Email files are currently unprocessed and unavailable.

Transfers

A vinyl record was transferred to the National Audio-Visual Conservation Center where it is identified as part of the Raul Ruiz Papers. Patrons are encouraged to contact the National Audio-Visual Conservation Center in advance of a research visit.

Copyright Status

The status of copyright in the unpublished writings of Raul Ruiz is governed by the Copyright Law of the United States (Title 17, U.S.C.).

Access and Restrictions

The records of Raul Ruiz are open to research. Many collections are stored off-site and advance notice is needed to retrieve these items for research use. Researchers are advised to contact the Manuscript Reading Room prior to visiting.

Technical Requirements

Digital files were created primarily in a Windows operating system. The content includes text files (.doc, .pdf, .rtf, and .txt), image files (.jpg and .tif), audio files (.wav), and moving image files (.vob).

At the time of processing, PageMaker 6.5 files were inaccessible through native software, but were accessed in LibreOffice Draw and converted to .pdf. Other text file formats were also inaccessible through available software. These files can be opened with a text editor or with a file viewer tool. As a result, the converted .pdf files and raw text files may not appear as intended in their original software environments.

An email .ost file, though currently unprocessed and unavailable, can be accessed in Outlook.

Scope and Content Note

The papers of Raul Ruiz (1940-2019) span the years 1921-2018, with the bulk of the material dating from 1967 to 2014. The collection documents Ruiz's career as an activist, journalist, and educator within the Chicano Movement, primarily focusing on the death of journalist Ruben Salazar in 1970. Material types include writings, newspapers, news clippings, résumés, pamphlets, handbills, transcripts, court proceedings, photographs, meeting minutes, reports, memoranda, syllabi,

printed matter, and documents associated with Freedom of Information Act requests. Video recordings, audio recordings, and some textual material and photographs are in digital formats. The papers are primarily in English and Spanish.

A sizeable amount of the collection pertains to Ruben Salazar, his legacy, and the investigation of his death after he was killed during a National Chicano Moratorium protest on August 29, 1970, a moment Ruiz captured in a photograph. Research files include articles by and about Salazar, investigative files of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, and inquest files from the Los Angeles County Office of Chief Medical Examiner-Coroner. The research relates to Ruiz's unpublished manuscript "Silver Dollar Death: The Murder of Ruben Salazar" of which there are drafts, abstracts, and loose pages in both physical and digital formats. There are multiple complete drafts, though the most recent is difficult to determine as many physical copies are undated.

Other significant topics represented in the collection include the East Los Angeles student walkouts ("blowouts") of 1968 and the establishment and activities of the Raza Unida Party, which Ruiz represented as a candidate for political offices in Los Angeles. Ruiz's role as editor of the newspaper *La Raza* is reflected in staff meeting notes from the 1970s and in his writings. Additional publications in which Ruiz was involved include *Inside Eastside*, *Chicano Student Movement*, and *El Popo*. The collection also reflects Ruiz's activism in education, specifically within the Los Angeles Unified School District and in his doctoral thesis on Chicano students at Harvard. Other noteworthy subjects related to the Chicano Movement include Católicos por La Raza, the Chicano Legal Defense Fund, the Brown Berets, Congress of Mexican American Unity, the Mexican American Political Association, and individuals including Sal Castro and Reies Tijerina.

Files from the 1990s and 2000s relate mostly to Ruiz's career as a professor of Chicano studies at California State University, Northridge, and include correspondence, syllabi, and classroom material. The papers also document cultural events organized and promoted by Ruiz as executive producer of Star Entertainment and Education Group in the 2000s.

The collection contains little documentation on Ruiz's personal life, though some biographical information can be found in oral history interview transcripts featuring Ruiz from 2012.
