

PART 56—TREATIES; CERTIFICATION FOR DEPOSIT WITH THE LEAGUE OF NATIONS

Section 56.1 Chief Clerk and Administrative Assistant. The Chief Clerk and Administrative Assistant, or in his absence the Acting Chief Clerk and Administrative Assistant, is hereby authorized and directed to certify, without seal, for the Secretary of State, a copy of each treaty or convention proclaimed by the President on or after January 23, 1934, and likewise a copy of every other international engagement entered into by the United States with a foreign country on or after January 23, 1934, which when so-certified will be forwarded by the Department to the American Minister at Bern for transmission by him to the Secretary General of the League of Nations for registration by the Secretariat of the League and publication in the League of Nations Treaty Series. Section 59.1 Secretary of State authorized to grant diplomatic visas. The Secretary of State is hereby authorized to grant diplomatic visas to diplomatic and consular officers of foreign governments in the United States, and to the members of their immediate families, to enable them to reenter this country. Such visas shall be valid for such period, not exceeding 2 years, as may be prescribed by the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State may grant such visas through such officials in the Department of State as he may designate, and under such rules as he may prescribe. Persons bearing passports visaed as provided above shall not be required, in order to reenter the United States, to have their passports visaed by diplomatic or consular officers of the United States abroad.
