SUBPART A—SUBSTANTIVE PROVISIONS

§ 212a.1 *Aliens seeking to enter the United States for the purpose of performing skilled or unskilled labor; application.* An alien of any of the classes described in section 101 (a) (27) (C), (D), or (E) of the act, and any alien described in the nonpreference category of section 203 (a) (4) of that act, who is ineligible to receive an immigrant visa and is subject to exclusion from the United States under section 212 (a) (14) of that act may apply, or the person, institution, firm, organization or governmental agency for whom the alien will perform skilled or unskilled labor may apply on Form I-129C for permission for such alien to enter the United States under the authority contained in section 212 (a) (14) of the act notwithstanding such ground of inadmissibility. The applicant shall be notified of the decision and, if the application is denied, of the reasons therefor and of his right to appeal within 10 days from the receipt of such notification in accordance with Part 7 of this chapter.

213.1 Authority to admit under bond or cash deposit. [Amended]

§ 213.1 *Authority to admit under bond or cash deposit.* An alien who applies for admission to the United States for permanent residence whose case is referred to the district director having administrative jurisdiction over the place where the examination for admission is being conducted, as provided in § 235.7 of this chapter, may be admitted to the United States in the discretion of such officer upon the furnishing of a bond on Form I-354, in the sum of not less than \$1,000, or, in lieu of such bond, upon depositing cash, which may be in the form of United States money orders or bank cashier checks, in the sum of not less than \$1,000 for the same purposes and subject to the same conditions as those set forth in Form I-354. * * *
