LEGISLATION CONTAINING ANTI-TERRORISM POLICIES

The Congressional staffers were provided with an index of statutes that directed them to further information, including police powers that contain provisions on anti-terrorist policies, and provided with books and explanatory notes relating to the UK's anti-terrorism policies and laws.
