Hong Kong

Dogs and Cats Regulations, 1950.

Japan

In Japan the subject of the treatment of dogs is governed by the Rabies Prevention Law [Law No. 247, August 26, 1950, as amended by Law No. 120, August 1, 1967] and its enforcement order [Cabinet Order No. 236, August 31, 1953, as amended by Cabinet Order No. 234, August 1, 1967]. The Law contains two disposal measures: Ordinary Disposition (Articles 4-7) and Disposal When Rabies Occurs (Articles 8-19).

Korea

No Korean law on this subject is found.

Republic of China

Subsection 6 of Article 66 of the Punishment for Defiance of the Police Act [September 1943] provides a punishment of detention for three days or less or a fine of 20 dollars or less for the maltreatment of animals.
