JAPAN

The term of office for members of the House of Representatives is 4 years, but the length of time in office may be curtailed if the House of Representatives is dissolved. The term of office for members of the House of Councillors is 6 years, and one half of the membership is elected every 3 years; 100 of the 252 members are elected from the nation at large (national constituency) and the remainder are allocated to the 46 prefectures roughly according to population.

The following are the dates of general elections held in Japan $\frac{2}{}$ from 1970 to 1980 and the percentage of voter turnout for each election:
