

UNITED ARAB EMIRATES

The United Arab Emirates is composed of several sheikhdoms, situated along the Trucial Coast of the Arabian-Persian Gulf, that have gathered together and signed the provisional Constitution of July 18, 1971.^{1/} Among these sheikhdoms, the two most important are: Abu Dhabi and Dubai, both ruled by hereditary families.

We have not found any provision or judicial precedent concerning the law of sovereign immunity in the United Arab Emirates.
