§ 37. Appropriations; reports.

There are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of sections 31a—33 and 34—38 of this title. Amounts expended under said sections shall be included in the annual reports to the Congress by the Departments concerned. (Aug. 9, 1946, ch. 931, § 8, 60 Stat. 967.)

§ 38. Cadets and midshipmen; inapplicability of leave payment provisions.

The provisions of sections 31a—33 and 34—38 of this title, shall not apply to cadets at the United States Military Academy or the United States Coast Guard Academy, or to midshipmen at the United States Naval Academy, or to cadets or midshipmen serving elsewhere in the armed forces. The respective Secretaries are authorized to prescribe regulations concerning leave for cadets and midshipmen. (Aug. 9, 1946, ch. 931, § 10, as added Aug. 4, 1947, ch. 475, § 3, 61 Stat. 749.)

EXCEPTION AS TO TRANSFER OF FUNCTIONS

§ 39. Applicability of sections 31a—33 and 34—38 of this title to commissioned officers of Coast and Geodetic Survey.

Sections 31a—33 and 34—38 of this title, relating to the granting of annual leave and compensation for leave accumulated in excess of sixty days on August 31, 1946, shall apply to commissioned officers of the Coast and Geodetic Survey to the same extent and with the same relative conditions as are provided therein for commissioned officers of the armed forces: *Provided*, That the term "Secretary" as used in such sections shall mean, in the case of commissioned officers of the Coast and Geodetic Survey, the Secretary of Commerce: *And provided further*, That in any case in which a commissioned officer of the Coast and Geodetic Survey on active duty on September 1, 1946, excepting officers on terminal leave on that date, had to his credit on August 31, 1946, accumulated or accrued leave aggregating in excess of sixty days, such leave in excess of sixty days not subsequently taken shall be settled and compensated for in cash on the basis of the rate of pay and allowances applicable to such officer on August 31, 1946, if application is made therefor to the Secretary of Commerce within one year after August 17, 1949. (Aug. 17, 1949, ch. 452, § 1, 63 Stat. 611.)

EFFECTIVE DATE

APPLICABILITY OF APPROPRIATIONS

§ 111a. Occupancy of government housing facilities on a rental basis without loss of rental allowances.

Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law (including any laws restricting the occupancy of housing facilities under the jurisdiction of Government departments or agencies by personnel, and dependents of personnel, of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard above specified ranks, or by personnel, and dependents of personnel, of the Coast and Geodetic Survey and the Public Health Service), personnel of any of the services mentioned in this section and their dependents may be accepted as tenants in and may occupy on a rental basis any such housing facilities, other than public quarters constructed or designated for assignment to and occupancy without charge by such personnel and their dependents if any, and such personnel shall not be deprived by reason of such occupancy of money allowances to which they are otherwise entitled for rental of quarters. § 111b. Occupancy of hotel at United States Military Academy on rental basis without loss of rental allowances.

After June 30, 1949, paid occupancy of the hotel on the grounds of the United States Military Academy on a rental basis by personnel of the services mentioned in the title of the Pay Readjustment Act of 1942 or by their dependents shall not deprive such personnel of money allowances for rental of quarters. § 112c. Transportation of dependents and household effects of civilian personnel of Naval Establishment stationed outside continental United States, monetary payment in lieu of transportation.

The dependents and household effects of such civilian personnel of the Naval Establishment (without regard to rank or grade) on duty at locations outside the continental limits of the United States, or in Alaska, as may be determined upon by the Secretary of the Navy, may prior or subsequent to the issuance of orders for the relief of such personnel from their stations, or subsequent to the discharge or release of such personnel from active service, be moved (including packing and unpacking of household effects) from such locations outside the continental limits of the United States, or in Alaska, to such locations as may be designated by such personnel, or dependents concerned, by the use of either Government or commercial means of transportation, and later from such locations to the duty station to which such personnel may be ordered, and current appropriations of the Navy Establishment available for travel and transportation may be used for this purpose. In lieu of the transportation in kind authorized for dependents, the Secretary of the Navy may authorize the payment in money of amounts equal to the commercial transportation costs (including taxes if paid), for the whole or such part of the travel for which transportation in kind is not furnished when such travel shall have been completed. The retired pay of any officer of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, Coast and Geodetic Survey, or Public Health Service who served in any capacity as a member of the military or naval forces of the United States prior to November 12, 1918, hereafter retired under any provision of law, shall, unless such officer is entitled to retired pay of a higher grade, be 75 per centum of his active duty

After July 1, 1946, the retired or retirement pay of any person whose name is borne on the emergency officers' retired list of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard of the United States and who is entitled to receive retired or retirement pay shall, in lieu of being computed upon the basis of the pay to which he was entitled at the time of his discharge from his commissioned service, be computed upon the basis of the rate provided in sections 101 and 107—109 of this title, for an officer of corresponding grade who is credited with the same number of years of service for longevity purposes as the number with which such person is credited. (June 29, 1946, ch. 523, § 6, 60 Stat. 345.)

§ 118a-1. Certification to Congress annually of Army and Navy officers entitled to flight pay.

On or before January 1, annually, the Secretaries of the Army and Navy, respectively, shall certify to the Congress by rank and age group the number of such officers above the rank of major of the Army or lieutenant commander of the Navy, with the average monthly flight pay authorized by law to be paid to such officers during the six-month period preceding the date of the report. (Feb. 18, 1946, ch. 30, title III, § 301, 60 Stat. 20; July 26, 1947, ch. 343, title II, § 205 (a), 61 Stat. 501.)
