Buffalo, January 30th 1861

Dear Sir

In communicating to you the enclosed letter of invitation,¹ I beg leave to add, to the sentiments therein expressed that I am desirous that whatever demonstrations may be made on your arrival here should be in accordance with your own wishes and feelings upon such subjects— And any intimations which may be given me as to the length of your stay in this city, the number who will be in company with you or the mode of your reception, will be very gratefully received; and will be carefully attended to, and treated as strictly private and confidential.
