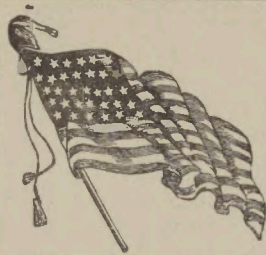

While we are marching to victory.

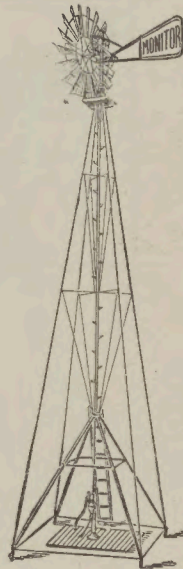

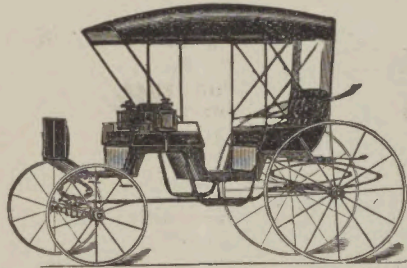
