(Continued From Page One) been inspected with a view of possibly making use of those buildings for a sanitarium in this section.

As Dr. Caswell's time is limited on this trip, it behooves one and all, who may be interested, to take advantage of this free territorial service of the health department.

A survey of the Office of Indian Affairs school children's skin test was completed this morning, and the survey of the Nome Public School children is expected to be completed this afternoon.

Other information on the subject and the hours allotted for X-Ray tests for Saturday, Sunday and Monday, at the Maynard Columbus hospital is as follows:

Dr. Thomas Moreom, Deputy District Health Officer, is particularly anxious that all adults with any symptoms or signs, referable to the lungs or where there is a history of Tuberculosis in the family, avail themselves of the Territorial Department of Health X-Ray Service at the local hospital on the following days and hours:

Saturday, April 10, hours 9 to 5.

Sunday, April 11, hours 9 to 5.

In addition to this service all children who have returned consent forms signed by parents, will receive the Tuberculosis test and X-Ray of the lungs, if test is positive.

Children's X-Ray Schedule

Sunday, April 10, hours 9 to 5.

Monday, April 11, hours 9 to 5.

All reports pertaining to X-Ray examinations will be sent to Dr. Moreom from the Department of Health at Juneau. No patient will receive such information direct.

It is well known that Tuberculosis of the lungs is often a disease of insidious onset and usually progressive; claiming most lives in the 15 to 30 age group. The Health Department is therefore attempting to carry out and sponsor a program of early diagnosis of the disease, which, if detected early is so often amenable to treatment, states Dr. Caswell.

**Kennecott Mine End Work In 2 Years, is Stated**

(By The Associated Press) SEATTLE, April 6—Permanent discontinuance of the operations of the Kennecott Copper Mining Company's properties in the vicinity of Cordova, will take place within the next two years, and, as a consequence, the operations of the Copper River and Northwestern Railroad will also be discontinued within that time, the railroad states in its annual report for 1936, made public on April 1st. The report says:

"Exploration work has been carried on by the Kennecott Copper Mining Company without disclosing any new bodies or ore or any favorable indications of ore. It is the present expectation that the mining company's operations of its Alaskan properties will cease in not to exceed two years. "The Kennecott Mining Company experienced many handicaps in 1936, due to the maritime strike, although the Alaska Steamship Company had a reasonably profitable year".

**Mistaken Identity**
