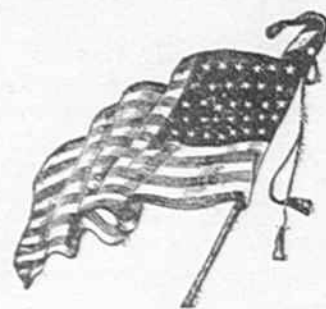

The Big Ball

The sixth annual ball of the Treadwell Fire Department was given last night at the Treadwell Club. An invitation was extended to all members of the Club (which includes all the employees of Treadwell); an invitation was also given to the Douglas Volunteer Fire Department. Besides this some two or three hundred other guests were invited. From the extent of the invitations it is easy to judge that the affair was a big event on Douglas Island.

The attendance last night was perhaps several hundred in excess of that of any previous occasion. The large hall was simply packed. The music was furnished by Prof. Wasterlain's orchestra. Supper was served at the Treadwell boarding house, where the big dining room is capable of seating 512 persons. However, on this occasion it was not large enough for the crowd and a part were served at a second sitting.

The Treadwell Fire Department is a volunteer organization and the big dance is given by the Treadwell company each year as a token of its appreciation of the interest taken by its employees in the protection of property. The Treadwell fire boys are proud of their big dance, and well they may be, for nothing attempted in the Northland can compare with it.

Great Things for Douglas

The citizens of Douglas propose to extend the City dock to Mayflower island, hitherto known as Juneau island. The extension will be a sixteen-foot driveway and will circle the island, giving the citizens a promenade of one mile along the water's edge. On the summit, which will be reached by a winding path, will be erected a dancing pavilion and club house costing \$10,000. On the lee side a monster float will be constructed for the use of fishermen and small craft, where boats can safely tie up in any storm.

The little island that has for so long withheld its fragrant beauty and usefulness from the citizens of Douglas will at last be utilized, and the only thing you can hear in Douglas nowadays is, "Are you going to the Island?"

When Superintendent R. A. Kinzie was told of the proposed scheme to connect and improve the island, making

a recreation ground for the citizens of Douglas, he heartily approved of it and said, "Put me down for \$500, and if you are short come again."

Mayflower island has many attractions, which, when brought within reach by the proposed plan, will make it a joy forever to the people of Douglas Island. Besides this, however, there is a very practical side to the proposition which appeals to the people generally and the business interests especially, and that is the providing of a convenient and safe anchorage for all kinds of small craft. No matter how the Taku may howl, within this little harbor boats may lie in perfect safety. The liberality of Mr. Kinzie has given the project a good start and as the scheme gets a good word from everybody it is safe to assert that the thing is just as good as done.
