"HOW TO REGISTER

The office of Armed Forces Information and Education and the States have joined forces to help persons who, by virtue of their service in the Armed Forces, will be absent from their legal voting places in this general election year.

This voting series will guide you as to your state's particular "Absentee voting laws!" Space limitations prohibit detailed information and the series will be general in this respect; it is for guidance only.

Arkansas, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, New Jersey, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Virginia, Wisconsin, Wyoming and Alaska.

There are no registration laws in the above listed state OR, members of the Armed Forces may vote in general elections without being registered. Use a Federal Post Card Application to apply for an absentee ballot, following your particular state's laws regarding absentee voting.
