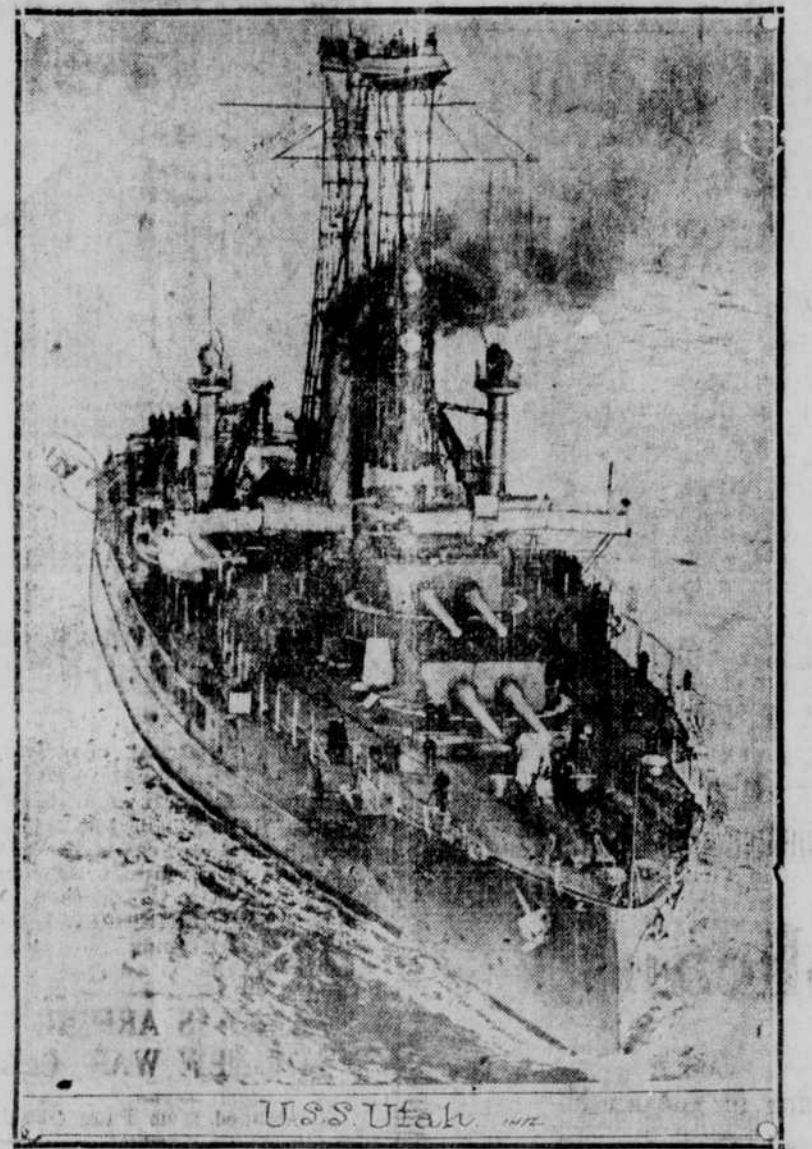

FOUR BATTLESHIPS DECLARED UNFIT.



Four of the first line battleships of the U. S. Navy have been declared by expert engineers to have unfit boilers and have been ordered not to steam at more than twelve knots. This forces the ships to leave the winter manuevers and make for their home ports, where it will require several months to repair them. Congress in the past has refused to make appropriations for the boilers. The ships are the Utah, the Florida, the Wyoming and the Arkansas, all coal burners.
