New Safety First at Sea Radio

This lifeboat is the first of its kind and is a new departure in safety first at sea. There is a specially trained crew to operate the portable radio which, in case of accident to the steamer, would at all times be able to maintain communication with rescue ships.

TUG SINKS IN HEAVY SEA; 3 MEN ARE LOST

Captain Claims Passing Steamer Could Have Saved All Aboard.

SEATTLE, May 1.—A dispatch to the Seattle Post-Intelligencer from Aberdeen says Samuel Anderson, Captain of the tug Ryba, declared the Etna Maru passed within a hundred feet from where the Ryba sank yesterday in heavy seas off Grays Harbor and probably could have saved all lives by lowering the boats. Three members of the crew of the tug were drowned.
The Captain of the Etna Maru has wireless that the heavy seas prevented him launching his life boats.

DID EVERYTHING POSSIBLE.
SEATTLE, May 1.—A dispatch to the Times said the officers of the Grays Harbor Stevedoring company declared the Etna Maru did everything possible to save the tug.
Captain Meland of the Lake Francis criticized the Etna Maru, saying if it had lowered boats all men aboard the tug could have been saved.

SCHOONER RAMMED AND SUNK; 4 OR 6 MEN ARE DROWNED

HALIFAX, May 1.—Four or six men are reported to have drowned this afternoon when the schooner Cape Dor sank off Nova Scotia. The steamer Clackama rammed her.
