NEW YORK, Aug. 24. (AP)—Miss Joan Fry of England lost to Mrs. Molla Mallory and the Whitman Cup remains in America. The English girl was defeated in one of the longest tennis matches of the five years competition for the prize. Helen Wills defeated Mrs. Godfree earlier in the day and Helen Jacobs lost to Betty Nutshall of England. At Southampton, William Tilden defeated George M. Lott, Jr., of Chicago to win the finals at Meadow Club. Lott played as well as he did on the previous day when he defeated La Coste, but he was at the mercy of Tilden at all times.
