NORSEMEN WERE FIRST TO SETTLE IN AMERICA; MONTH OF MARCH 1903

The Norsemen were really the first Europeans to colonize America, although their settlement was only temporary and of no effect upon our history.

Thorfinn Karlsefni, an Icelander, in March 1003 brought to this country, which they called Vinland, four ships and 160 people.

Just where they landed is not known, but an old tower in Newport is credited to the Norsemen by Longfellow. The settlement lasted about three years, the colonists returning home on account of internal dissensions and the hostility of the natives.

LEGAL NOTICE

PROPOSAL (A) FOR FISHING PRIVILEGES ON THE MOQUAWKIE RESERVATION

1. Sealed bids will be received by the undersigned up to and including the 12th day of March 1929 at the hour of 5 o'clock p. m. and thereafter publicly opened at the office of the District Superintendent, Bureau of Education, Anchorage, Alaska, for the exclusive fishing privileges on the Moquawkie Reservation for a period of one year, beginning with the date of acceptance of bid. The right to reject all bids is hereby reserved.

2. The bidder must agree to construct one hand or beach trap, and a snoodly 25 king salmon gill nets and 25 red salmon gill nets for the use of the natives on the reservation, together with the necessary dories, anchors, scows, and other fishing gear required.

3. The bidder shall also state the price to be paid for king salmon, red salmon, chum salmon, pink salmon and arctic red salmon and shall name a maximum sum to be guaranteed to the reservation and shall furnish surety company bond in a sum not less than \$5,000 for the faithful performance of the contract to be entered into between the bidder and the reservation, a draft of such proposed contract to be submitted with the bid, such draft of such contract to set forth clearly the terms and conditions upon which fishing shall be carried on and the class and quantity of the gear furnished.

to be made on the 10th day of July for all fish caught up to and including the 30th day of June and for all fish caught thereafter on the 15th day of August; it being understood that if the value of the fish taken from the reservation shall at any time exceed the amount of the bond given, then settlement for such excess shall be made immediately upon demand.

PROPOSAL B

Proposal B to read the same as proposal A, except in paragraph one insert "for a period of two years" instead of "one year". In paragraph two insert after "beach trap" and one pile driven deep water trap."

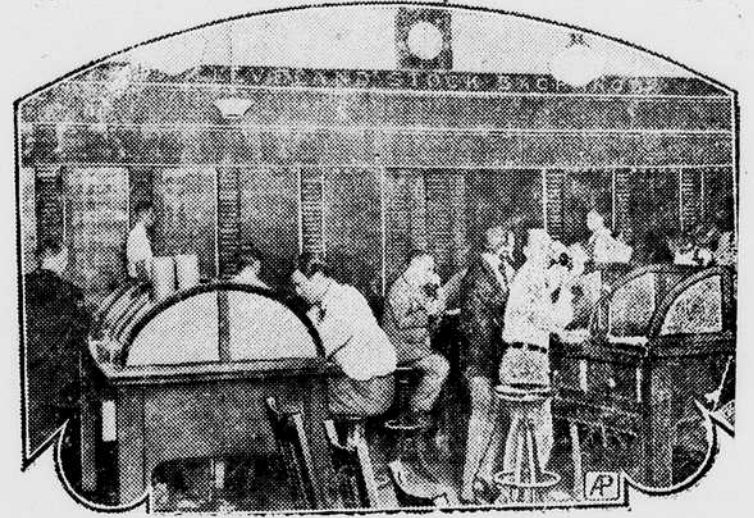
PROPOSAL C

Proposal C to read the same as proposal B except in paragraph 1, insert "four years" instead of "two years."
