As Mr. Geist said: "The programs are certainly appreciated and the news a God-send."

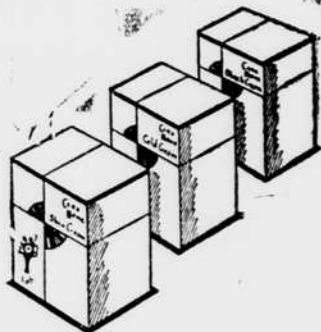
In the Intercity basketball games this winter between Anchorage, Fairbanks and Seward, airplanes may be brought into play for transportation providing the round trip fare is within reason.

**ALASKA ITEMS OF
 INTEREST AT THE
 NATIONAL CAPITAL**

The House committee on appropriations will, in a few days, start the consideration of the budget estimates for the various supply bills of the government. The Interior Department bill, in which Alaskans have particular interest, will be considered starting November 16. In view of the general demand for economy it is understood that the allowance made for this department is fairly satisfactory. However just what the various sums are will not be made known to the public until the budget is presented to Congress by the President. Until that time the various committee hearings will be of a secret nature. The Interior Department has summoned to Washington Governor George A. Parks, head of the Alaska road activities; Ike P. Taylor, chief engineer of the road commission, and Burton H. Barndollar, examiner of accounts of the Alaska Railroad; Charles E. Naghel, disbursing officer of the road commission and other activities in Alaska of the Interior Department; Geo. C. Dickens, general agent of the railroad at Chicago; Paul W. Gordon, director for Education for Alaska; Dr. Fellows, medical director for Alaska. The Governor will likely be the first to appear before the committee, and he is expected to stress the importance of a more liberal appropriation than the \$494,000 allowed for the present year to the Alaska Road Commission. The new Democratic administration, through the Interior Department, will have control of the Alaska Road Commission after March 4, and it is expected that their Democratic appropriations committee will deal more generously with Alaska's needs than did the House committee last spring when but \$354,000 was allowed for the commission, that was raised \$140,000 by the Senate committee.
