AN ORDINANCE.

An Ordinance to Prohibit the Sale of Second-Hand Clothing in Forrest City.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Forrest City, Arkansas:

SECTION 1. That hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to engage in the business of selling or bartering castoff or second-hand clothing in the corporate limits of Forrest City.

SEC. 2. Any person who shall engage in the business of selling or bartering second-hand clothing in the said city of Forrest City, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in the sum of twenty-five dollars.

SEC. 3. Each day that any person shall engage in the sale of second-hand clothing in said city, shall constitute a separate offense.

SEC. 4. That all ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed and that this ordinance be in force from and after its passage.
