EXPIATED THEIR CRIME

Thomas and William Halderman paid the penalty with their lives, at Tombstone, last Friday, for the cowardly murder of Constable Chester Ainsworth and deputy, Teddy Moore.

Thrice had a stay of execution been secured: first, through appeal to the supreme court, then by intervention of President McKinley, who granted the condemned men a reprieve for sixty days, till October 10, and finally Governor N. O. Murphy gave them a further respite until November 16, that he might review the case.

Strenuous efforts were made to save the necks of the condemned murderers. Appeals from influential sources in Texas and elsewhere were received; an attempt was made to discredit a part of the testimony introduced in the trial of the prisoners for the murder of Moore.

The Haldermans hoped up to the last moment that the executive arm would be interposed to save them from the gallows.

The story of the condemned men's bearing, their maslin statements on the gallows, and especially their prayers to a sound mind, is disgusting to a sound mind.
