Governor Murphy goes to Washington this week in the interest of statehood. Greater confidence would be felt in his effort were it not for the knowledge that the prolongation of the governor's political career is dependent upon Arizona's remaining a territory.

W. D. Bell has purchased an interest in the Phoenix Enterprise and is now associated with A. S. Mills, as editor and proprietor. The Enterprise under Mr. Mills' management has become one of the newest and best of the Arizona dailies, and we hope it will enjoy increased influence and prosperity under the new management.

The death of Senator Davis is reckoned peculiarly unfortunate, inasmuch as he is said to be the only member of the senate committee on foreign relations who has mastered the complicated details and can explain the effect upon our commerce and international relations of the ratification of the various reciprocity treaties now pending.

Delegate J. F. Wilson left for Washington last week, to be present at the opening of congress on next Monday. Owing to the shortness of the session and the subjects of national importance to be considered, it is not probable that legislation for the territories will receive much attention. However, Col. Wilson may be depended upon to do his utmost to secure an appropriation for the building of the San Carlos dam, and it may be that Arizona's plea for statehood will receive recognition along with the claims of New Mexico and Oklahoma.

**CAUSE FOR THANKFULNESS.**

We as a nation have much to be thankful for on this beautiful November day. We have reason to be thankful that the Pilgrim fathers appointed a day of thanksgiving, thus inaugurating a festival which has become one of our principal national holidays. They had little to be thankful for, compared with the manifold blessings which Providence has bestowed upon us. Half of the little company of Pilgrims had died after landing at Plymouth, and doubtless the survivors felt deeply grateful that they were alive. They, perhaps, felt as Mr. Dooley has expressed it—"Be thankful for what ye have not, Hinnaisy."

We in Arizona should be thankful that we are favored above the people of almost any other portion of the United States—possessing a territory unsurpassed in natural resources, a climate unrivaled on the face of the earth, and a generous measure of prosperity for all who are not too indolent to work. The past has been generous to us and the future is bright with promise.

**ARCHIMEDES' DREAM REALIZED**

Pearson's Magazine for December contains an article under the head of "Tapping the Sun's Rays," by C. Montgomery McGovern, descriptive of Dr. Wm. Calver's pan-helio-motor, to harness the sun's rays and convert their concentrated heat into a merchantable commodity. "With the sun-motor in commercial use," says the writer, "it will be no longer necessary to denude the forests, or delve into the bowels of the earth, before we can heat our homes, or make the steam required in our factories, railroads and ships."

The farthest degree of heat that anyone has, heretofore, been able to make is the 6000 degrees that has been registered in the electric arc. Dr. Calver, it is claimed, is able with his arrangement of 16,000 small mirrors, to generate 34,000 degrees of heat, and of this he is able to control 10,000 degrees with perfect safety.

The first attempt to use the pan-helio-motor for practical purposes is to be made at Tucson, Arizona,

the intention being to employ the new power to pump water for irrigating. Dr. Calver thinks that his company will easily be able to keep a large section of country supplied with an abundance of water at an insignificant cost. Col. Lee Crandall is interested in the company.
