Celebration in New York of Anniversary of Birth of John Wesley.

President Roosevelt's Address on Methodism Which Was Delivered Yesterday in Carnegie Hall.

New York, Feb. 27.—The bi-centennial meeting of the birth of John Wesley was celebrated here at Carnegie hall last night.

Mr. Chairman, Ladies and gentlemen: I am glad of the chance of addressing this representative body of the great church which Wesley founded.

Since the days of the revolution not only has the Methodist church increased greatly in the old communities.

For a century after the declaration of independence the greatest work of our people, with the exception only of the work of self preservation under Lincoln.

During this century the work of the pioneers of our country has been in consequence assumed a position of immense importance throughout the vast region west of the Alleghenies which has been added to our nation since the days when the Continental Congress first met.

From this fact we have largely learned the fact that together with the rest of the pioneers and the pioneer preachers; and all honor be given to the Methodists for the great proportion of these pioneer preachers whom they furnished.

These preachers were of the stamp of old Peter Cartwright—men who suffered and overcame every hardship in common with their flock.

They had to possess the spirit of the pioneer; and not of the man who could merely suffer, not of martyrs who could oppose only passive endurance to wrong.

As far as we can tell, the great work that must inevitably be done by those who set as the first harbingers, the first heralds, of civilization in the world's dark places.

It is easy for those who stay at home in comfort, who never have to see humanity in the raw, or to strive against the dreadful naked forces which appear clothed, hidden, and subdued in civilized life.

And now friends, in celebrating the wonderful growth of Methodism, in rejoicing at the good it has done the country and to mankind, I need hardly ask a body like this to remember that the greatness of the fathers becomes to the children a shameful thing if they use it only as an excuse for inaction instead of as a spur to effort for noble aims.
