NEW RAILROAD FOR COCONINO

Eastern Capitalists will soon
 undertake the construction of
 about 110 miles of railroad in
 Coconino county connecting Flag-
 staff with the White Mesa mining
 properties. It is believed that
 development will show the great-
 est body of copper ore in the
 world in this White Mesa coun-
 try. The work of development
 is going on and if the drills make
 a favorable showing, railroad

construction will be begun at
 early date.

Pending the completion of
 railroad, ore will be hauled by
 the mines in huge Caterpi-
 lar trucks. It will be necessary
 to spend \$20,000 to put the road
 in shape for hauling the ore.

 erty is owned by the Ariz-
 on Copper Exploitation Compa-
 ny. The name of this company
