## ROAD CONDITION CAUSES MUCH COMPLAINT

Hereford Bridge Still in Bad Shape--San Pedro Practical-ly in Floods--Valley Highways Impassable.

Road conditions in Cochise county still are reigning topics of conversation. The term, lack of road conditions, is perhaps better, according to those who are forced by situation to travel over the highways and byways of the section. The only road in a real travelable condition, is that between Tombstone and Douglas, thro the Warren District.

The residents of the San Pedro country, as well as those of the Sulphur Springs valley, are up in arms. Many who make their way into Bisbee declare that the roads are all but impassable. They add that there doesn't appear to be any chance of eliminating the cause of complaint.

The bridge of Hereford across the San Pedro is in the same condition in which the December floods left it. In other words only the light laden vehicles can pass the stream, the San Pedro being nearly in flood at this time. The prospectors and farmers from the Huachuca section are complaining and all declare that something must be done in order to clear up the situation.

On the other hand the supervisors are doing all that they can in regard to the matter of improvements to roads. If it were possible for the board to spend an unlimited amount of money on this or that road, it would probably be done without delay. This is not the case, however, and though the supervisors are as anxious to see conditions improve they are curtailed by the law and by the fact that the very people who desire roads are those who pay the taxes and who are the final judges on the matter of expenditures of county funds.

## TO CHECK WAR'S EVIL BANE ON CHILDREN

NEW YORK, Feb. 5.—The enlistment of the 20,000,000 children of the United States in an army of helpfulness to relieve suffering both in this country and Europe is the purpose of a movement which is announced here by a committee of educators of nationwide reputation. It includes Chas. W. Elliot, president emeritus of Harvard University, David Starr Jordan, president of the National Educational Association, and Richard McLaurin, president of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

It is the belief of those interested in the plan that evil influences in the schools of the United States are arising from the war. Influences of being hated and murder are moulding the lives of America's 20,000,000 children, says an announcement of the committee's plans, "which tend to crush out truth, justice and love. As a nation we are evading our responsibilities in not seriously attempting to counteract these evil influences from their lives."

## FAVORABLE REPLY ON RETENTION OF TROOPS

Senator Smith Wires that he Called on Secretary of War Who Inferred Favorable Action on Matter.

That the protests of the people of the Warren District and of Douglas will carry considerable weight with the war department, was indicated yesterday when Secretary Joe Gray of the Commercial Club, received a wire from Senator Smith. The senator stated that he took the matter of the retention of the troops on the Arizona border up with the secretary of war yesterday morning and had received a favorable reply. Senator Ashurst and Congressman Hayden are yet to be heard from but it is expected that their course of action will be similar to that taken by Mark Smith.

The dispatch of the telegram to the Arizona delegation in Congress was occasioned by the fact that the business men and officers of El Paso were asking the war department to transfer the troops now located in Douglas, to the Gate City.

The people of Arizona, and particularly those of Cochise county, who have seen the damage wrought by the contending factions in Mexico are insistent upon the troops being left where they are. For months last fall bullets fell in the United States and the presence of the troops alone, prevented further and more dangerous hostilities.

Douglas has been busy for several days along the same line and from the telegram received from Senator Smith it would appear that the war department is content to let the troops remain where they are for some time to come. With the rumblings and grumblings of the war clouds in Sonora, a movement of the soldiers to another state, where there is little or no need for them is said to be nearly out of the question.
