Chicago Rumbles Before the Convention.

BOISE, BLAND, or BLACK-BURN.

The Big Tidal Wave--The Peoples Party Stand--Silver Everywhere.

RESCUERS AT WORK

General Happenings Throughout the Country.

CHICAGO.--Senator Blackburn of Kentucky, is among the recent arrivals. He was in conference, during the greater part of the day, with the silver delegates from all parts of the country, Col. Phil Thompson, who accompanied Senator Blackburn, says the senator will unquestionably be placed in nomination.

VACUOUS, B. C.--The steamer Empress of China arrived last night with Yokohama news of July 18. Regarding the recent earthquake wave says: Accounts thus far received place the center of disturbance in the vicinity of the celebrated island of Kinawa and indicate that fully 5,000 lives were lost.

ST. LOUIS.--Hon. H. E. Taubeneck, chairman of the peoples' party national executive committee, is opposed to ex-Congressman Bland for president and will entertain no proposition for a compromise with the democratic party which does not include Senator Teller for that proposition.

DENVER.--Senator Henry M. Teller returned to Colorado today and on arriving in Denver from Cheyenne was met by a great outpouring of people from all parts of the state. The demonstration was non partisan and it is doubtful if the scenes of enthusiasm enacted on the leading streets of the Colorado capital tonight have been paralleled in western history.

CHICAGO.--In the conference today with the executive committee of the national committee the silver men made it clear that they would expect to consult them, and in case of failure to consult them, and the selection of a presiding officer whose views were not in harmony with those of the majority they would be heard from in the convention. The silver men stated that they would accept any man designated by the national committee, provided he was a man of recognized standing in the party, whose views were understood every where to be in accord with their own on the financial question.

WILKESBARRE.--Pa.--The situation at the Twin Shaft tonight remains unchanged. Rescuers are bending every energy to their work, but it is agoniz-
