Delegates Swarming Into the Windy City.

SILVER MEN LEAD.

Hill and Bryant Named for Temporary Chairman—A Gold Bugs Views.

ANOTHER BIG STRIKE.

General Happenings Throughout the Country.

Chicago.—Delegates are arriving by the score and the principal hotels are crowded to their fullest capacity. The silver men are in the majority and there seems to be no question but what the white metal will rule. The gold men are trying to gain a point in the selection of a temporary chairman who will appoint a majority of gold men on the committees but silver men are active and will not allow them to seal a march. Although the national committee stands 27 to 23 against the silver men.

William J. Bryant of Nebraska has been settled on by the silver men as temporary chairman and Senator Harris of Tennessee as permanent Chairman.

There is some talk of the committee selecting Vice-president Stevenson for temporary chairman, in which case the silver men will doubtless acquiesce. The talk of abrogating the two-thirds rule seems to be dying away.

Chicago.—Ex-Governor Rowell P. Flower of New York arrived this afternoon. He made the following significant statement: "I don't believe the gold men can support any of the candidates so far mentioned, especially if they are to stand upon a free silver platform."

"Will the gold men then bolt?" "I am not prepared to say as to that but I reiterate my previous statement about our support."

Chicago.—The movement to make Senator Hill temporary chairman received a decided impetus during the day and there are good reasons for believing the executive committee of the national committee will be pleased to suggest his name if they felt it would be accepted by the silver men.

Chicago.—Iowa men have been preparing to make a strong fight along the line of delegates, beginning tonight. It is stated by the Boies managers that they are using the same tactics successfully employed by Dan Mannin when Cleveland was nominated the first time.

CLEVELAND, O.—The condition at the Brown Hoisting company works Saturday morning indicated that today will witness one of the most serious labor troubles this city has ever experienced. Despite the riot and killing of

Wm. Reitter a number of non-union men took their places in the shops today. The feeling of unrest among the men in manufacturing district is more intense than at has been at any stage of the strike. Groups of men idled along streets to denounce the police and soldiers. The feeling against Mayor McKisson and his cabinet is very bitter.
