## THE LATEST NEWS

### The Platform Declares For Free Silver.

BLAND IN THE LEAD.

### Teller Has The Floor—No Nominations Until Tomorrow.

### TILLMAN AND HIS FORK.

### General Happenings Throughout the Country.

### Chicago.—It is probable no nominations will be made today.

The wildest excitement pervades the convention when opportunity presents itself many delegates rise from their seats at once loudly protest while the aisles are crowded and several times the sergeant at arms and aides have been compelled to clear the aisles and restore order. Senator White of California is permanent chairman.

### The Committee on platform have reported and a silver plank 16 to 1 is endorsed also an anti A. P. A. plank granting civil and religious liberty to every citizen. Three hours are to be given to discussion of the platform. Hill will be given the last half hour.

If the platform is adopted which undoubtedly will be some of the gold delegates will bolt.

Plank endorsing present administration was cheered by a number of delegates. A large part of the audience are on their feet and the chairman is rapping for order. Tillman of South Carolina, offering an amendment and has been granted five minutes for speech.

Hill has had the floor most of the morning and is making bitter speeches. Efforts are being made to reach ballot on platform tonight but gold-bug tactics will delay matters and nominations may not be made until tomorrow.

All morning papers concede that Bland chances are best for the nomination. The key to the situation rests with Alabama, Georgia, Mississippi and North Carolina although several of delegations are strong Teller men.

1 p. m.—Minority platform report makes all money at parity with gold and is cheered by gold bugs.

A Boies banner is being carried in the hall and enthusiasm manifested.

Teller was called for and greeted with prolonged and deafening applause as he took floor.

LATEST—Hill's motion to a 10pt minority report voted down 303 ayes to 626 nays which is the strength of both factions.

The wildest excitement prevails, hats, banners etc., are thrown in air and the shouting is deafening. The

band is playing but not a note can be heard.

A vote is to be taken on endorsing present administration but is certain to be lost with silver men in the majority as shown in previous vote.

CHICAGO.—Bland in reply to an inquiry telegraphed: "Religion is not an issue. I am a methodist, have always been one; always will be. If I was as good a Catholic as my wife I would not worry about getting to heaven. This is the sentiment I expressed in a previous emergency when her religion was criticized. I stand by it now." At Sibley's headquarters it was stated today that Sibley had about concluded Teller is an impossibility. It is intimated that Sibley will announce himself a full fledged candidate today. The Sibleyites are receiving assurances of support from southern and western delegates.
