The Silver Platform.

The following in the financial platform of the Democratic party adopted at Clie go: Recognizing that the money question is paramount, we invite attention to the fact that the federal constitution named silver and gold together as money metal; and that the first coinage law passed by congress under the constitution, made the silver dollar as a unit of value, and admitted gold free coinage at a ratio measured by a silver dollar limit. We declare that the act of 1873, demonetizing silver without the knowledge or approval of the American people, has resulted in the appreciation of gold and corresponding fall in price of commodities produced by the people a heavy increase burden of taxation enriching the money lending class at home and abroad, paralyzing of industry and impoverishment of the people. We are unalterably opposed to a single gold standard. Gold monometalism is a British policy founded upon British greed. We demand the immediate restoration of free and unlimited coinage of gold and silver at the present legal ratio of 16 to 1 without waiting for aid or consent from any other nation. We demand that the standard silver dollar shall be full legal tender, equal with gold for all debt, public or private, and we favor legislation to prevent the demonetization of any kind of legal tender money by private contract.
