THE STORM

Havoc Wrought by the Big Blizzard.

MUCH STOCK PERISHED.

The Aggregate Loss Not as Much as Anticipated—Five Lives Lost.

ZERO WEATHER STILL ON

OMAHA—Final details of the great storm that has swept Nebraska for six days were received today. Much stock has perished on the extreme western range where there were few ravines which afforded shelter to the animals. The aggregate is not so large as anticipated, however, and though zero weather continues the snow is rapidly disappearing.

ST. PAUL—News from the great blizzard has been meagre today. So far as known only five lives have been lost. Of course nothing has yet been heard from the remote districts beyond the reach of the telegraph and it may be another week before it can be positively stated that there has not been more serious loss of life.

THE BIG CHAMPION PURSE

A National Bank Closes its Doors—Granted a New Trial.

MAY SAVE HIS NECK.

HAMBURG—Owing to the lack of work several warehouse companies have been obliged to suspend operations. There are now 12,000 men out on a strike.

SAN FRANCISCO—Martin Julian this evening telegraphed an acceptance of Dan Stewart's offer for a final fight between Corbett and Fitzsimmons for a \$15,000 purse. He has sent a similar telegram to Corbett.

KANSAS CITY—The Missouri National bank closed its doors this morning owing to heavy withdrawals by one of its principal depositors. Deposits are \$1,500,000.

SAN FRANCISCO—The supreme court today handed down a decision in the case of W. H. Thompson, alias Kid, one of the men who was tried for attempting to rob the Southern Pacific train at Roscoe. Thompson was convicted and sentenced to be hanged. The supreme court now reverses this decision and grants a new trial on the ground that the lower court erred in its instructions to the jury.
