### BLOCKS ARE FLOODED.

### WHAT MR. HAYS SAYS

Believes Cleveland Would Not Veto It—The Pressure for Revenue

### CONGRESS OPENS MONDAY

WASHINGTON—Senator Hale today expressed the opinion that the senate would take up and he hoped would pass the Dingley bill at the coming session beginning next Monday. "We ought to have it," he said "for the treasury reports show great need of more revenues. I am quite persuaded that Mr. Cleveland would not veto the bill if it should be presented to him."

J. Earnest Walker, of Phenix, has an interesting collection of Confederate money, which can hardly be equalled outside a museum. It comprises authentic samples of nearly all the currency issued by the southern Confederacy during the time of the late unpleasantness. EAU CLAIRE, Wis.—Owing to the floods there is a total suspension of railway traffic on the Wabash and Durand branch of the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul railway. Great damage has been done farms along the Chippewa river. The farmers families who escaped to the railway track from the rising waters were rescued by trainsmen and an engine.
