CITY AND COUNTY OFFICIAL PAPER

A concession has been granted by Governor Guadalupe Maniero, of Victoria, for the construction of a railroad from San Miguel, a town opposite Rio Grande city, Texas, to the gulf railroad. The federal government will give him a subsidy of \$5,000 each kilometer constructed. United States capitalists will furnish the money for the enterprise.

The results of close competition in some lines of business is illustrated by the report of the Giant Powder company at its annual meeting last Wednesday, when it was shown that during the year 7,000,000 pounds of powder had been made, on which the profit was \$1,700. In the face of such meager profits it would look if competition may give place to consolidation.

The tramp question is again agitating the authorities along the railroads and steps are being taken to keep them moving. The Tucson jail is crowded with petty offenders, mostly tramps, and they are increasing daily in numbers. Tombstone being off the main line is not troubled very much, and the fact when a suspicious looking stranger arrives he is compelled to leave at once, deters this class of tourists from seeking this health resort.
