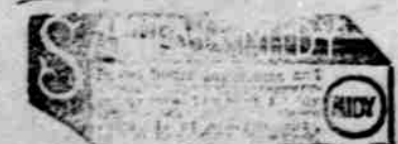

### MASS OF ICE AND DEBRIS

Matters Look Threatening and Hourly Worse—People Moving

### OTHER CITIES IN DANGER

CHIPPWEA FALLS—With the water again climbing the outlook for this threatened valley is still rather uncomfortable. For fifteen miles below Chippewa Falls and Eau Claire and for nearly the same distance at Durand the river is a mass of hacked ice and timber and is hourly becoming worse. The water has been backed up, flooding parts of Durand and the lower levels of this city and people are still moving from their houses. The lumber mills are surrounded and partially engulfed by water which has frozen. Nearby business places and dwellings are in the same predicament although being a little farther away from the river channel, their situation is not so serious.

Fitzsimmons Begins Suit and the Fight Will Begin Again in Court

### THE MONEY IN STATU QLO

SAN FRANCISCO.—Although Sharkey was awarded the decision after the eighth round in the battle with Fitzsimmons, the referee declaring that Fitzsimmons had struck a foul blow, the sailor may not get the purse after all. At any rate he will have to make a legal fight for it which may prove a harder struggle than the fight. When Referee Wyatt Earp decided that Fitzsimmons had struck Sharkey a blow below the belt and that Sharkey was the victor on a foul he handed Lynch who is Sharkey's backer and manager a certified check on the Anglo-California Bank for \$10,000. Fitzsimmons promptly protested and consulted an attorney who decided to enjoin the bank from paying the money until the courts could pass on Sharkey's right to the purse. Yesterday soon after the bank opened Lynch presented the certified check and demanded payment. To his surprise the bank official refused to honor the check.

### Earp Ruffled Over Comments on His Decision

### HE MAINTAINS HIS STAND

### Corbett Sends a Telegram and is Ready—The Hamburg Strike

### SNOWFALL IN GEORGIA

SAN FRANCISCO.—Wyatt Earp is very indignant over the comments on his decision in the Sharkey-Fitzsimmons fight and loudly maintains that his decision was fair and honest. He says the foul was plainly intentional.

NEW YORK.—James J. Corbett telegraphed Sharkey as follows: "Tom Sharkey, San Francisco, Cal.—I am very sorry at Mr. Fitzsimmons' foul tactics in his contest with you which prevented your getting a decision over him in the full ten round contest without a foul. I am ready to meet you on or before January 1, 1897."

ATLANTA.—A snow storm of almost unprecedented severity for this season of the year, broke out this morning. Snow commenced falling at 6 o'clock and continued without cessation until 12, when it lay four inches deep.

HAMBURG.—Various meetings of strikers were held today to consider the situation in view of the refusal of the employees to submit the disputes to a court of arbitration. It was resolved to call upon the strikers' committee to declare the strike general.
