Arsenic Put in Bread to Injure a Baker's Business

MANY CASES CRITICAL

MILWAUKEE.—What is thought to be an attempt at wholesale poisoning in a large measure successful was reported to the police yesterday when information given of the sudden serious illness of about 100 families between 500 and 600 persons living in the northwestern part of the city. The cause of the sickness was traced to bread sold at a bakery owned by Otto Fogesthaler. An analysis of the bread showed that it contained arsenic. The sick persons are living but a large number of cases are convalescing with intent to cause the death or serious illness of Fogesthaler customers, with the object of ruining his business. Arrests will be made tomorrow.

THE DEMAND INCREASING.

SAN FRANCISCO.—The demand for flour in Australia continues to be increasing; two ships have been chartered to carry 4,500 tons to Sydney. Besides these shipments orders have been placed for 30,000 or 40,000 barrels which will go by rail.
