ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

BE IT KNOWN, That we, R. B. Tannahill, F. L. Bernard and R. R. McKinley, do hereby associate ourselves together and form a corporation under Chapter II of Title XIII, Revised Statutes of Arizona 1901...

ARTICLE I.—The name of the corporation is BISBEE EXTENSION MINING COMPANY and its principal place of transacting business in Arizona is Bisbee. Offices may be established, business transacted and meetings of stockholders and directors held at such places within or outside of Arizona as the By-Laws of the Company shall provide...

ARTICLE II.—The general nature of the business proposed to be transacted is to make contracts; to purchase, lease, option, locate or otherwise acquire, own, exchange, sell, or otherwise dispose of, and deal in, mines, mining claims, mineral lands, coal lands, oil lands, timber lands, water and water rights and other property both real and personal, and to work, explore, operate and develop the same, and to deal in the products and by-products thereof...

ARTICLE III.—The amount of the authorized Capital Stock of the Corporation is TWO MILLION, FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS, divided into TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND shares of the par value of TEN dollars each...

ARTICLE IV.—The time of the commencement of the corporation shall be the day these Articles are filed in accordance with law, and the termination thereof shall be twenty-five years thereafter...

ARTICLE V.—The affairs of this corporation shall be conducted by a board of not less than three nor more than fifteen directors, by whom a president and vice-president shall be elected and a secretary and treasurer appointed.

ARTICLE VI.—The directors shall adopt bylaws for the government of the corporation and may amend the same. They shall have power to fill vacancies occurring in the board from among their number an Executive Committee, which, to the extent provided by resolution or by the said bylaws, shall have and exercise the powers granted the directors by these articles.

ARTICLE VII.—The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which the corporation as at any time to subject itself is TWELVE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS.

ARTICLE VIII.—The private property of the stockholders of the corporation shall be forever exempt from corporate debts of any kind whatsoever.

PROCLAMATION OF ELECTION FOR THE RATIFICATION OR REJECTION OF THE CONSTITUTION FRAMED AND ADOPTED BY THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION OF ARIZONA.

By the Acting Governor of Arizona. I, George U. Young, Acting Governor of Arizona, in accordance with the Act of Congress known as the Enabling Act, approved June 20, 1910, and Election Ordinance Number 1, for the proposed State of Arizona, approved by the Constitutional Convention, December 8th, 1910, do hereby order and proclaim:

That, on Thursday, the 9th day of February 1911, a general election shall be held by the qualified electors of the Territory of Arizona for the Ratification or Rejection of a Constitution framed and adopted by a Constitutional Convention, the members thereof having been duly and legally elected by the qualified electors of Arizona pursuant to the Act of Congress, known as the Enabling Act, approved June 20, 1910.

That said election shall, in all respects, be held and conducted in the manner required by the laws of the Territory of Arizona for election with said Enabling Act, and as supplemented by Election Ordinance No. 1 of the Constitutional Convention.

That, under the provisions of the laws therein, when not in conflict said Act of Congress, a qualified elector at said election shall be any male citizen of the United States of the age of twenty-one years, who shall have resided in the Territory of Arizona at least twelve months next preceding the date of the election heretofore held for the election of delegates to the said Constitutional Convention, who shall possess in other respects the qualifications of an elector as provided by Title Twenty, Revised Statutes of Arizona, August Second, Nineteen Hundred One, and whose names shall appear upon the Great Register of the County in which he seeks to vote as said Great Register is constituted by Section 19, of said Enabling Act, or as may hereinafter be provided by Act of Congress, shall be entitled to vote at said election.

I further proclaim, That the ballots used in voting at said election shall be prepared, printed, furnished and distributed as required by the election laws of the Territory of Arizona.

That the entire constitution as framed and adopted shall not be certified on the ballot, but, in accordance with the provisions of Election Ordinance No. 1 of the Constitutional Convention, the submission of the proposed constitution for the proposed State of Arizona, to the people of Arizona, for ratification or rejection, shall be upon a ballot in the following form:

"Shall the Constitution for the proposed State of Arizona, as framed and adopted by the Constitutional Convention, be ratified?"

Yes. No.

That, at the said election all qualified electors voting shall vote directly for or against the said proposed Constitution.

That all Boards of Election shall make returns of the said election direct to the Secretary of the Territory, at Phoenix, the Capital, as provided by Section 21 of the Enabling Act.

That the Election Laws of the Territory of Arizona now in force, as far as are applicable and not in conflict with the said Enabling Act, including the Penal Laws of said Territory relating to elections, illegal voting and other illegal practices thereof, are hereby extended to the election herein provided for.

And I do hereby offer a reward of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars for the arrest and conviction of any and every person violating any of the provisions of Title IV, Part I, of the Penal Code, such reward to be paid until the amount hereafter expended for the purpose reaches the amount of One Thousand (\$1000) Dollars.
