Pay roll demand for the salaries of county officers for the first half month of March was allowed and ordered paid from the Salary fund in the sum of \$740.37, warrants No's. 85 to 101 were issued in payment thereof.		
In the matter of the application of Gustav Becker for a franchise to construct an Electric Light & Power Line, over and across the public roads and highways of Springerville and Eagar and other towns and places in Round Valley, after a consideration of the petition the Board ordered that in compliance with Paragraph 2362 Revised Statutes 1913 that the clerk have a notice published for three weeks stating that on the 7th day of May 1917 the board proposed to grant such franchise to Gustav Becker. And that any one opposed to the granting of such franchise would be heard on that date.		
The following ordinance was unanimously adopted by the board and the same ordered published as a notice in both the papers in the county for 4 consecutive issues; the ordinance is as follows: "It is by the Board of Supervisors of Apache county, Arizona, found that St. Johns, Springerville, Eagar and Concho are all four towns of more than five hundred population and it is by said board ordered that hereafter no person shall build any corral, barn, stable or other yards or buildings where domestic animals, horses or cattle are kept in any of the said four towns above named, so that the outside of the said corral, barn, stable or other yards or buildings shall be closer than fifty feet to a public street. Provided that where any lot now made and surveyed is too small to permit said yard or building to be placed that far away then that said yard shall be at least one-half the width of the lot back from the street. Any building hereafter erected contrary to this ordinance shall be deemed a nuisance and the person so building shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor"		

Reports of the various county and precinct officers were checked, found correct, and approved by the board.

The report of Joe Burgess county treasurer for the month of March was checked and approved, said report showing the following:

The Board of Supervisors reconvened at 8 a. m. there being present all members and clerk.

In compliance with the law that requires the moneys in the county treasury to be counted and verified each quarter, the Board of Supervisors proceeded to verify the Treasurers statement as to the moneys on hand, with the following result:

The contract submitted by Trost & Trost, Architects for the Court House, for the signature of the Board were rejected on account of no bond accompanying the same. The clerk was instructed to notify them to submit new contract covering the furnishing of the plans and specifications for the sum of 3 1/2% of the cost of the building, and to accompany the said new contract with the required \$5000.00 bond and that then the same would be accepted and signed.

Upon motion and by unanimous vote Mrs. E. J. Udall was reappointed Fair Commissioner for Apache County for the year 1917.

Chairman Heber Jarvis moved, seconded by W. A. Saunders and carried unanimously, that Sylvester Peralta be appointed court Interpreter at a fixed salary of \$30.00 per Month; said appointment effective from and after April 1st, 1917.

In the matter of locating a site for the Court House to be built by Apache County, petitions having been presented for several different sites, after thoroughly considering the matter, Supervisor W. A. Saunders moved, seconded by John C. Hall, and carried unanimously that the Majority Report of the Committee appointed on December 29th, 1916 to select a site for this building, be accepted by this board; but that if anytime between now and the special meeting to be held on the 18th of this Month, the majority of said committee should reconsider their previous selection of the west 1/2 of the Patterson block, lots 2 & 3 block 95 of the St. Johns Townsite, and recommend to the board that the court house be built on either the Anderson lot on main street, or the block owned and occupied by School district No. 1 (White school house) that the board would then accept that recommendation. It being distinctly understood that any reconsideration of sites by this committee shall be by not later than the 18th of this month, otherwise the court house will be built upon the Patterson block.

In the matter of the claim of Dr. T. J. Bouldin for \$170.00 for

services in inspecting and quarantining contagious diseases for the month of March, said claim being in addition to his regular salary of \$50.00 per month, the board after a conference with Dr. Brown representing Dr. Bouldin reached an agreement whereby from and after March 1st 1918 Dr. Bouldin is to receive the sum of \$100.00 per month the same being payment in full for all services of any description rendered to the county of Apache as Registrar of Vital Statistic, Superintendent of health and office of county Physician to which he is hereby appointed. The county agreeing to furnish all necessary supplies to the physician and also to pay all necessary travelling expense incurred in the discharge of his duties. In view of this agreement the claim for \$170.00 was rejected, the increase of salary to date from March 1st.

The clerk was instructed to send a resolution from this Board of Supervisors to the Live Stock Sanitary Board requesting them to pay a salary of at least \$50.00 per month to Ed Cole who now holds a commission as Deputy Ranger for the northern end of the county from Sheriff E. W. Grimes, and is receiving the sum of \$50.00 per month from this county. It being absolutely essential that the stockmen in that

district have some protection, and if the Live Stock Sanitary Board does not pay this amount to Mr. Cole the stockmen of that vicinity will have to.

Supervisor W. A. Saunders moved that Under-sheriff John R. Coleman be appointed as Janitor and Jailor for the Sheriffs office at an additional salary of \$25.00 per month. Motion seconded by John C. Hall. Members Saunders and Hall voting for; and Jarvis against said motion.

In the matter of the resolution of the Board of Supervisors passed on the 15th. day of July A. D. 1913 fixing a speed limit for Motor driven vehicles within the limits of the town of St. Johns, Springerville, Eagar & Concho at Fifteen (15) Miles per hour, and providing a penalty for the violation of this ordinance. The Board of Supervisors ordered that a copy of this resolution be given the Sheriff and that he be notified that the ordinance is still in full force and effect, and asked to see that the provisions of the same are strictly enforced in the above mentioned towns. It was also ordered that signs be placed on the streets of the above named towns Notifying the Public of this speed limit.
