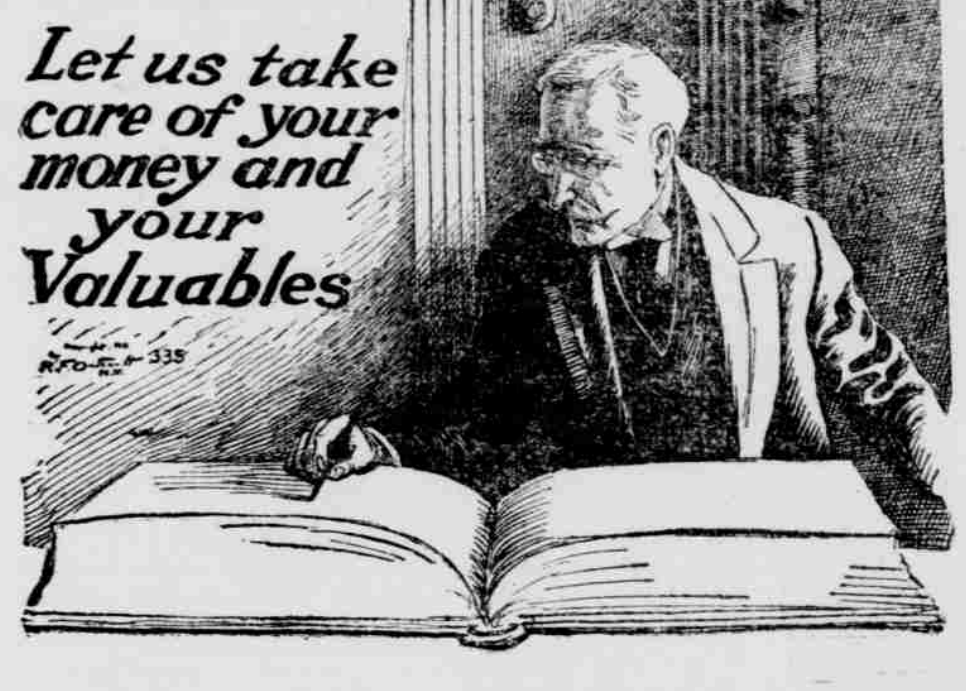
Walter J. Hayt will officiate in his absence, which will continue about sixty days.
