MAKING A PRESIDENT

Second Day of the Illinois Convention.

PRESIDENT MCKINLEY EULOGIZED

The Populists Indulge in Recrimination—Republicans Accused of Using Money.

PEORIA, Ill., May 8.—The second day of the State Republican convention was marked by intense excitement. An immense and brilliant crowd was present. Among the fashionably dressed women on the platform was Mrs. John R. Tanner.

Joseph W. Fifer was chosen permanent chairman. He was given an ovation. He eulogized McKinley, and references to the president were received with tremendous cheering. Senator McCullom appears to have firm control of the convention.

THE FOREST RESERVES.

The Problem of Allowing Grazing to be Investigated.

WASHINGTON, May 9.—Gifford Pinchot, forester of the department of agriculture, and F. V. Coville, botanist of the same department, will leave Washington for the west about May 15, to make personal investigation of the problem of grazing on the forest reserves. The restriction of sheep grazing in these areas has raised a storm of protests from wool growers, and public feeling in the west has become divided and intense.

COEUR D'ALENE TROUBLE.

President is Sustained—A Minority Report.

WASHINGTON, May 9.—The investigation of the Coeur d'Alene affair ceased today. The committee report that the military did not exceed its authority. Merriam was ordered to Idaho by McKinley, and simply obeyed the president's instructions.

NEARLY OUT OF WIND.

Jeffries-Corbett Mill is Likely to Fall Through.

NEW YORK, May 9.—The coming Jeffries-Corbett mill may yet fall through. Jeffries insists that Charlie White shall referee, while Corbett says Sam Austin shall act in that capacity.

The Populistic Row.

SIoux FALLS, May 9.—The Populist National convention delegates spent this morning denouncing the claims of the Cincinnati convention to represent the party. Edgerton of Colorado declared that money was being freely used by the Republicans to bolster up the middle of the road cause.

WITHDRAWAL OF TROOPS.

Unless Trouble Occurs at Elections Withdrawal will Begin in June.

WASHINGTON, May 9.—Secretary Root has decided that the reduction of the military force in Cuba shall begin before the end of July, unless trouble should occur at the municipal elections which would make it advisable to continue the present force. There are between eight and nine thousand soldiers in the island now, and recently the secretary directed that 400 more be sent there before the middle of June.

A SENSATIONAL SPEECH.

Irish Are an Erased and Powerless Factor.

LONDON, May 9.—Bulletin—At the annual meeting of the Primrose League this evening, Lord Salisbury made a sensational speech against Ireland, which is destined to stir up a tempest on the north side of the channel. Referring to Ireland and the death of home rule and other political issues, the prime minister said: "There is no hope that we shall give Ireland practical independence, for we have learned from South Africa how a disloyal government can accumulate armaments and thus secure terrible advantage."

THE STREET CAR STRIKE

An Amicable Adjustment Does Not Seem Possible

ST. LOUIS, May 9.—Up to 10 o'clock this morning there had been no change in the street car strike. According to an agreement between the city authorities and the railway company no attempt was made today to run the cars. The night force of police was immediately sent home after twenty-four hours of continuous service.

Increased the Fare.

TACOMA, May 9.—Regular single first-class fare to Cape Nome has been increased to \$150. The Victoria is the only vessel having any accommodations left.

Naco Items.

Day before yesterday, Bert Sullivan, an American, was arrested in Naco and placed in jail, on the Sonora side. Five minutes later a Mexican was introduced to the interior of a jail on the United States side.

Mrs. J. M. Miller, wife of Linerider Miller, has been critically ill for the past several days at Naco. Dr. Edmundson of Bisbee has been attending the lady, and she is reported as convalescing today.

Dr. Glark, physician for the Coetzema Copper Co., at Nacosari, accompanied by his family, arrived in Bisbee yesterday, and will remain a few days.

BOERS ARE PANIC-STRICKEN

Censored Press Report Favor the British.

A SPANIARD WITH THE DUTCH

Finding Poisoned Bullets the Enraged Britishers Bayonet Boer Prisoners.

CAPE TOWN, May 9.—It is reported that the Boers of the Ladybrand district are panic stricken, believing their retreat to the north to have been cut off. It is hoped here that French, who is believed to be near Ladybrand, will succeed in intercepting some of the Boers' convoys.

Killed a Spaniard.

LADYSMITH, May 9.—In a recent skirmish near Elandsdrage, a Spaniard, who was fighting with the Boers, was killed.

Taking Up New Positions.

SMALDEEL, May 8.—(Delayed)—The Boers are reported to be taking up a position at Boschrand, on the lower Zand river west of Kroonstad. It is reported that the Boers on the north of Roberts' front are retreating. A large number of Burgheers are already surrendering.

Bayoneted Twenty-Five.

VICTORIA, B. C., May 9.—A British soldier who was in the engagement of Spionkop, in writing relatives here, says his party took fifty Boer prisoners. A search of their clothing revealed the fact that half of them had poisoned bullets. This so enraged the British that they bayoneted twenty-five of the Boers on the spot.

A Total Wreck.

MELBOURNE, May 9.—The iron sailing vessel, Sierra Nevada, from Liverpool, has been totally wrecked on the heads. The captain and twenty-two of the crew were lost.

Jack Osler, a miner in the employ of the Copper Queen company, happened to a serious accident while at work in the mine last evening. It is reported that about 200 tons of dirt came down, completely covering the unfortunate man for some time, breaking his right arm in two places and otherwise doing him bodily injury. The injuries, however, are not considered fatal.
