

BATTLE ABBEY IS OPENED FOR GREY VETERANS

Confederate Memorial Institute at Richmond to Be Kept Open for Inspection During Reunion of Soldiers of South

IN MEMORY OF THE PART SOUTH PLAYED

Great Events of War to Be Commemorated in Carvings and Paintings in Beautiful Buildings - Great Historic Collection

Richmond, Va., May 30. - The Confederate Memorial Institute, known as the Battle Abbey, has been opened for inspection in connection with the United Confederate Veterans' reunion, which is to be held here June 1 to 3.

The building, completion of which awaits the return of the artist, Charles Hoffbauer, from the European war, stands in the western part of Richmond, in the center of a five-acre park, a gift from the state of Virginia.

The hall in the south wing will be known as the Memorial room, for the decoration of which Thomas P. Ryan of New York and Virginia contributed a large sum.

To Charles Broadway Rouss is attributed the credit for having conceived the idea of the Confederate Memorial Institute.

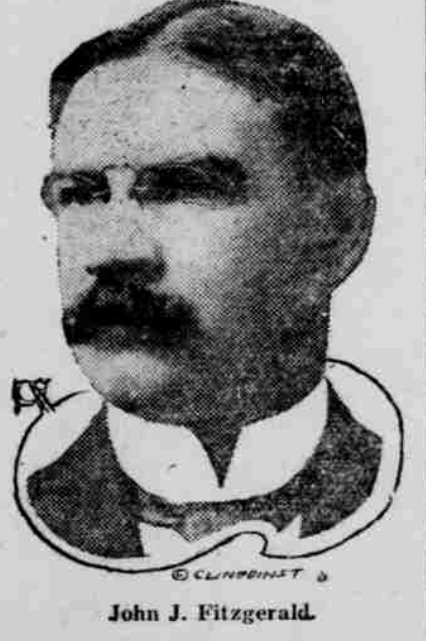
