

NEW COURSES TO BE OFFERED STUDENTS

Several Innovations Made at University of Arizona by Dr. Wilde

TUCSON, Ariz., May 24.—In connection with the work of rearranging the classes at the university for next term, several important announcements were made to the students in the department of economics.

Under the instruction of H. A. E. Chandler, professor of economics, a new subject will be introduced into the economic course.

The announcement that there is to be a course offered in public speaking under the department of economics has aroused considerable interest among all students inclined towards debating.

Changes will be brought about in the courses now being offered in corporation management and banking.

HAS NEW HUSBAND; FORMER CLAIMS HER

Mikado of Japan Cancels Divorce Granted to Wife of Sea Captain

LOS ANGELES, May 24.—A divorce suit in which the final decree was granted last March, and the plaintiff in which is believed to have been married again, may be reopened if attorneys for the husband in the case can prove that the verdict of the highest court of Japan was reversed by the mikado after the husband had been sentenced to life imprisonment.

The case is that of Elizabeth J. Lewis against Albert Lewis. The interlocutory decree was granted in March, 1910, on the wife's showing that her husband had been sentenced to a life imprisonment after being convicted of wrecking a vessel off the coast of Japan. In March, 1911, Mrs. Lewis again appeared and was given a final decree.

In the meantime Lewis and his son, Arthur Hill, who was arrested with him, had interested the American and British consuls in their behalf. They succeeded in proving that the vessel was wrecked outside the three-mile limit, or in international waters, and the case was carried to the mikado.

Yesterday attorneys for the husband appeared before Judge Monroe of the superior court and asked that the case be reopened on the grounds that the mikado has reversed the judgment of the court. The ruling of the Japanese court, as well as the ruling of the emperor, were all in the Japanese language, which Judge Monroe could not read. He ordered that the hearing go over for three months in order to allow the husband's attorneys to find whether the mikado's ruling is in the form of a pardon or a reversal. If it is a pardon the decree cannot be set aside under the law, while if it is a reversal of the court's judgment the decree can be vacated.

It is understood that Mrs. Lewis married soon after receiving her final decree and is now in the east with her new husband.

PREPARING FOR SPEEDWAY EVENT AT INDIANAPOLIS

Greatest Automobile Race in History Will Be Pulled-off Memorial Day—Making Ready for Trials for Eligibility Saturday

INDIANAPOLIS, May 24.—Highly "tuned" and mechanically as perfect as the skill of the modern motor car maker can produce, forty-six of the fastest racing automobiles ever assembled are at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway awaiting the elimination trials next Saturday, which will determine whether they are eligible to start in the 500-mile international sweepstakes race on Memorial Day, May 30.

It has been nine months since the initial announcement of this contest was made by the promoters and each month has witnessed an increase of interest on the part of the public as well as the manufacturer.

The long race has assumed even greater proportions than the promoters had anticipated when the purse of \$25,000 in gold was offered for the winners of the first ten places.

Conditions of the Race. The conditions of the race, which is a class E event, are that each car shall weigh at least 2,300 pounds and have no more than 600 cubic inches engine displacement.

Estimates on the average speed which will be attained in the long race have varied widely, but experts express a belief that the winner will travel the 500 miles at a rate of about 75 miles per hour.

The race will start at 10 o'clock in the morning and probably the winner will cross the tape on his last lap about 5 o'clock in the afternoon.

SUSPECTED HOLDUP MEN ARE SET FREE

Lack of Evidence in Train Robbery Case Brings It to Termination

OGDEN, Utah, May 24.—Magistrate Murphy ordered Bryan O'Hare and Victor Clore, who have been held in the county jail on the charge of robbing the Southern Pacific Overland limited train January 2 last, discharged, there being no sufficient cause to believe the men guilty of the offense.

O'Hare and Clore were arrested near Detroit, Mich., some weeks ago and extradited for trial. Their preliminary examination was concluded two weeks ago since which time Judge Murphy has had the evidence under consideration.

The latest development in the train robbery case when announcement was made by the police department that it was investigating an alleged confession or a man known as "Tex" Hamilton made to an intermediary, that he planned the robbery which was executed by O'Hare and Clore and also to receive a share of the \$5000 reward offered for the apprehension of the robbers.

24 POISONED FROM EATING BAD CHICKEN

PEABODY, Kas., May 24.—As the result of ptomaine poisoning caused by eating diseased chicken at a missionary meeting at the home of Mrs. Ben Dohner, near this city, on April 23, Mrs. A. B. Nelson, wife of a farmer living near here, died at her home yesterday the second victim of the poison, which made twenty-six persons ill.

Juanita Clausen, a farmer's child, died a week ago. Twenty-four other persons are now in a dangerous condition.

Physicians who investigated said the chicken was diseased and that Mrs. Dohner was blameless.
