STOCKS AND BONDS

NEW YORK, Oct. 13. -- Railroad and industrial stocks moved in opposite directions again today, transportation, especially, the speculative variety, denoting further accumulation, while industrials and associated specialties were variable or hesitant.

There were a few striking exceptions, as in the case of Lackawanna Steel, which strengthened on its excellent statement of earnings and several of the equipments and oils.

Sentiment among professional traders was once more governed by the money market. Call loans opened at 8 per cent, advanced to 9 at midday and mounted to 10 just before the close.

This sensitive condition was attributed mainly to the withdrawal of \$8,000,000 of government deposits and final preparations for Friday's payment of the Anglo-French loan of \$500,000,000.

Coppers yielded again on reports that the refined metal is being offered for immediate delivery at 16 1/2 cents and advices from Pittsburgh and other steel centers confirmed recent advances of concessions for fabricated iron and steel. In shipping circles freight rates were said to be in process of downward revision. Sales amounted to 525,000 shares.

Some of the industrial bonds, including United States Steel five were heavy but other domestic issues, including Liberties were steady to firm. Total sales, par value, \$17,200,000. Old United States bonds unchanged on call.
