Lt. Tate's office is on the main floor of the Special Building, also on the Old Post.

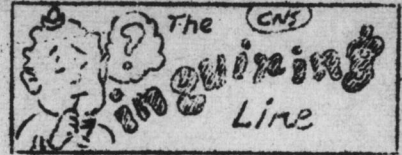

an EM in the 17th Special Service Unit and Post Special Services before entering the MAC OCS at Camp Barkley, Tex. As an enlisted man, he appeared on a national radio hook-up with Wayne King on a War Bond program; he also appeared as a guest solist with the Salt Lake City Symphony Orchestra. Commissioned a 2nd Lt., March 15, 1945, he returned to the Fort and was assigned as executive officer in the Dir of Ind Services office.

Prior to entering the Army, Lt. Whisonant was well known on the concert stage, having appeared with the Radio Music Hall of the Air under the direction of the late Erno Rapee for four weeks. Q. I am a Wac engaged to a soldier who was just discharged. If we get married, will I then be eligible for discharge?

A. A Wac can obtain a discharge if she marries a veteran of the armed forces who served any time since Sept 16, 1940. You may apply for release as soon as you are married, but not, of course, while you are engaged.

Q. I'm awaiting my discharge on points. Meanwhile, I hear the railroads are hard up for manpower. What are the chances for a man without railroad experience?

A. Pretty good. More than 24,000 vets are now filling vital jobs on the nations railways, and not all of them were in that line before the war. The WD specifically states that many skills acquired in the army are needed by these carriers, and the roads also have 62,000 openings for unskilled workmen. Applicants should get in touch with the Railroad Retirement Board or the U. S. Employment Service.
