

DENVER CONDUCTOR ASSAULTED DURING FARE CONTROVERSY

DENVER, Colo., Aug. 15.—Following dispute over payment of an additional one cent fare, Frank Mantilla, a street car conductor on the Twenty-ninth avenue line late today was beaten so badly it was feared tonight he would die.

An unidentified passenger boarded Mantilla's car at Forty-fourth and Grove street, offering five cents fare. The conductor declined the fare, declaring the cost of riding was six cents.

In the fighting that followed the argument Mantilla was so badly beaten it was said at the hospital he had suffered internal injuries.

MEXICO DROPS CARRANZA STAFF MEXICO CITY, Aug. 14.—Francisco Murguía, Francisco Uruquosa, Francisco de P. Mariel and Federico Merelias, followers of President Carranza, commander of Mexican troops in North Mexico, have been dropped from the roll of the army it was announced today.

All officers who fled from the country have also been divested of their military honors, the announcement says. The first four are in the military prison here awaiting trial on charges arising out of Carranza's death.
