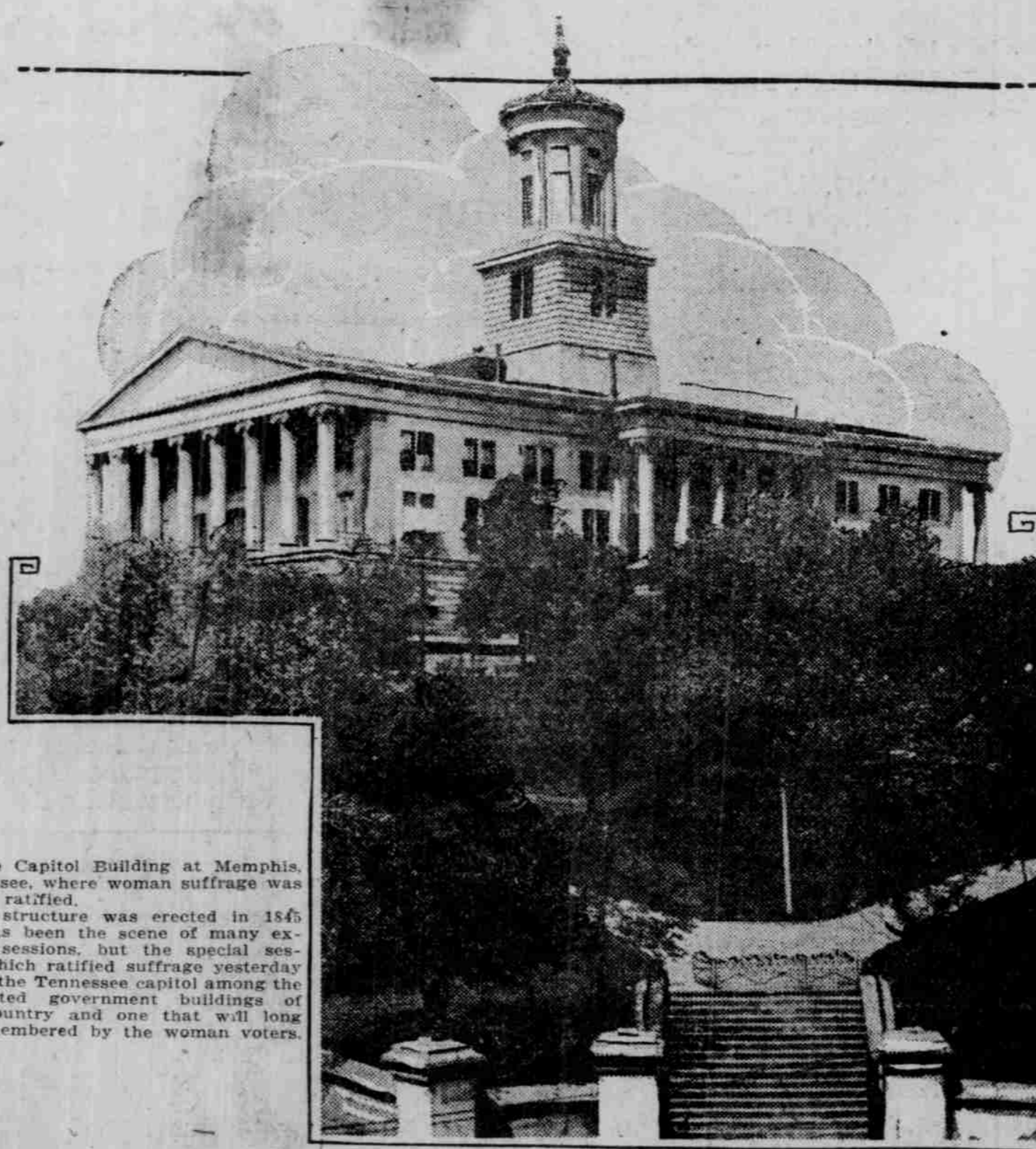


TENNESSEE CAPITOL
